SUBJECT: Ratification of Flagler County Emergency Proclamations Extending the State of Local Emergency Due to Severe Coastal Erosion and Vulnerability.

DATE OF MEETING: March 4, 2024

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: Flagler County has been under a declared state of local emergency due to Hurricane Matthew since October 4, 2016. During that time, other storms have struck the County exacerbating the damage to the dune system and compounding the exposure of public and private property on the barrier island to future storms and flooding. The County declared local states of emergency for Hurricane Irma (2017), Hurricane Dorian (2019), Hurricane Isaias (2020), and Hurricanes Ian and Nicole (2022).

Due to the cumulative effect of the storms as well as tidal events, nor'easters, and erosion generally, Flagler County continues to be in the most precarious position relative to ocean flooding and storms in its history. Public and private property on the barrier island remain vulnerable to catastrophic storm damage without further and sustained protective efforts. FEMA and Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) have provided grant funding to renourish portions of the coastline in the northern portion of the County. The Board hired a coastal engineer to conduct a study which forms the basis of a long-term beach management plan for the County.

In addition, the County working with the Army Corps, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), City of Flagler Beach and others to restructure the beach renourishment project in Flagler Beach to include an expanded project from the north border of Gamble Rogers State Park continuously to North 7th Street. The Board authorized this approach, which will require considerable work with the involved agencies and private owners who are affected. This modified project will provide a more resilient and robust dune renourishment with substantially increased berm length and sand quantities applied to the beach. The Army Corps has approved the County's Certification of Lands, a necessary step in the process that ensures the County has secured on behalf of the Army Corps the necessary staging, access, and construction easements as well as right of way permits to allow the project to proceed.

Continuing the state of local emergency will help the County with the foregoing efforts and allow the County to take any other necessary emergency measures, including expedited procurement and the issuance of emergency administrative orders, as necessary, to restore, protect and maintain the dunes and beaches or any other viable buffer between the community and the Atlantic Ocean.

Flagler County UAS pilots will engage in a series of structured testing phases, providing handson feedback and data to FNN's team. This partnership between the Flagler County UAS team and Fire Neural Network marks a significant step forward in the practical application and advancement of UAS technology. By combining governmental insight with cutting-edge R&D, this project is poised to yield significant benefits for public service operations, setting new standards for efficiency, safety, and technological excellence in UAS operations.

Statement of Work Flagler County Bruno Luna

1. Project Purpose: This project aims to provide research and development feedback for Fire Neural Network on using advanced fixed-wing UAS technology equipped with RGB/thermal and multispectral camera payloads to conduct comprehensive mapping of coastal areas, enhance fire detection capabilities, assess forest flammability, monitor plant health, detect invasive plant species, and evaluate beyond visual line of sight (BVLOS) capabilities. These activities are intended to improve environmental monitoring, enhance public safety, and contribute to the ongoing development and refinement of fixed-wing UAS applications.

2. Scope of Work:

2.1 Coastal Mapping and Fire Detection:

- **Objective:** To utilize RGB and thermal imaging technologies to create detailed maps of coastal regions and identify and provide live video feeds of wildfires to public safety personnel.
- Activities:
 - Conduct flights over designated coastal areas to collect RGB imaging data.
 - Analyze live video feeds to identify hotspots indicative of potential fire activity.
 - Develop protocols for rapid data processing and sharing with local fire departments and emergency services.

2.2 Forest Flammability and Plant Health Assessments:

- **Objective:** To employ multispectral imaging payloads to assess forest flammability, conduct plant health assessments, and monitor for invasive plant species.
- Activities:
 - Perform targeted surveys over forested areas using multispectral imaging to gather data on vegetation health and flammability.
 - Analyze data to identify areas at high risk of fire, unhealthy plant populations, and the presence of invasive species.
 - Collaborate with forestry departments to refine survey methodologies and data interpretation for actionable insights.

2.3 Beyond Visual Line of Sight Capabilities Assessment:

- **Objective:** To assess the BVLOS capabilities of the UAS, including loss of link procedures, the use of visual observers, and adherence to safety standards.
- Activities:
 - Plan and execute BVLOS flight operations in compliance with regulatory standards and project objectives.
 - Test and document loss of link procedures, including automatic return-tohome and manual recovery methods.
 - Evaluate the effectiveness of visual observers during BVLOS operations and develop best practices for their deployment.
 - Conduct a comprehensive safety audit of BVLOS operations, focusing on risk mitigation and emergency response protocols.

3. Deliverables:

- Detailed reports and maps generated from RGB/thermal and multispectral imaging data, including analysis of coastal mapping, fire detection, forest flammability, plant health, and invasive species monitoring.
- A comprehensive evaluation of BVLOS capabilities, including documented procedures for loss of link scenarios, visual observer use, and a safety standards checklist.
- Recommendations for the application of fixed-wing UAS technology in environmental monitoring and public safety, based on the project findings.

4. Project Management:

- Bruno Luna, representing Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, will oversee project operations, including pilot coordination, data collection and analysis, and reporting.
- Regular updates and coordination meetings will be scheduled to ensure project objectives are met within the defined timelines.

6. Evaluation and Reporting:

- Performance will be evaluated against the quality and usefulness of the collected data, the efficiency of operations, compliance with safety and regulatory standards, and the achievement of project objectives.
- Final reports will be submitted to Fire Neural Network and relevant stakeholders, summarizing findings, achievements, and recommendations for future applications.

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: Staff is seeking approval to lease an agricultural tractor to be used for maintaining dirt roads and rights-of-way in Flagler County's unincorporated gas taxable roadways. This lease is in line with our process for rolling stock of heavy equipment to replace old models moving to surplus. This tractor is required to continue maintenance of County dirt roads with a drag box attachment and/or to mow rights-of-way with a batwing mower attachment as needed.

Road & Bridge is in the process of placing 3 tractors for surplus that have been used to drag dirt roads. Our approved budget for FY2023-2024 includes the lease of a new tractor. Leasing has been determined to be more fiscally responsible than purchasing due to the maintenance cost of aging equipment.

SUBJECT: Consideration to Approve 4-year Commitment with Identified Vendor for Public Safety Radio System Add-on.

DATE OF MEETING: March 4, 2024

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: Our current vendor for all Public Safety Radio system services would be interfacing our existing radio system with software to control and monitor device status with GPS location capabilities providing instant access to radios and/or vehicle location. This feature will also provide greater safety posture for all first responders and public safety staff in the event of emergency.

The goal is to create a more intuitive system that will help all users of our radio system with more information during incidents and other resources to increase their operational awareness. To receive the greatest discount for this feature, this would be a 4-year subscription commitment, paid out annually.

SUBJECT: Consideration of a Resolution and Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement.

DATE OF MEETING: March 4, 2024

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: Staff is seeking approval of a resolution authorizing the County Administrator, or their designee, to enter into a Statewide Mutual Aid Agreements with the State of Florida.

The Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement (SMAA) allows for the provision of support, in an emergency or disaster, from one community (local government, district, etc.) to another within the State of Florida, to include support to and from the State itself.

The SMAA provides a process that allows communities providing Mutual Aid to claim reimbursement of incurred expenses from the community requesting Mutual Aid consistent with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and/or State of Florida reimbursement guidelines even without a Federal Disaster Declaration. The State of Florida, its Counties, and all but a few local governments are participants in SMAA. Also, other political subdivisions of the state such as School Districts, Water Management Districts, etc. are frequently participants as well.

The SMAA that is currently in place, executed in 2018 was updated by the State of Florida in 2023 to update and clarify a variety of provisions.

The Emergency Management Act, Chapter 252, Fla. Statutes, provides each local government the authority to develop and enter into a mutual aid agreement with the State of Florida for reciprocal emergency aid and assistance in case of emergencies. The assistance is provided when emergencies are too extensive to be dealt with unassisted and to ensure the timely reimbursement of costs incurred by the local governments which render such assistance.

WHEREAS, this Resolution authorizes the request, provision, and receipt of interjurisdictional mutual assistance in accordance with the Emergency Management Act, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, among political subdivisions within the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Flagler County, Florida that:

- 1. The County Administrator, or their designee, is authorized to execute and adopt the Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement, as approved as to form by the County Attorney, as well as any subsequent versions, modifications, and related documentation and attestations.
- 2. This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

STATEWIDE MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT - 2023

This Agreement is an acknowledgment of receipt by the Florida Division of Emergency Management ("the Division") and the local government ("Participating Party") signing this Agreement. Execution of this agreement replaces all previous iterations and is active until a new agreement is drafted and requested by The Division.

This Agreement is based on the existence of the following conditions:

- A. The State of Florida is vulnerable to a wide range of emergencies and disasters that are likely to cause the disruption of essential services and the destruction of the infrastructure needed to deliver those services.
- B. Such emergencies and disasters often exceed the emergency response and recovery capabilities of any one county or local government.
- C. Such incidents may also give rise to unusual and unanticipated physical and technical needs which a local government cannot meet with existing resources, but that other local governments within the State of Florida may be able to provide.
- D. The Emergency Management Act, chapter 252, *Florida Statutes*, provides each local government of the state the authority to develop and enter into mutual aid agreements within the state for reciprocal emergency aid in case of emergencies too extensive to be dealt with unassisted, and through such agreements ensure the timely reimbursement of costs incurred by the local governments which render such assistance.
- E. Pursuant to chapter 252.32, *Florida Statutes*, the Division renders mutual aid among the political subdivisions of the state to carry out emergency management functions and responsibilities.
- F. Pursuant to chapter 252, *Florida Statutes*, the Division has the authority to coordinate and direct emergency management assistance between local governments and concentrate available resources where needed.

Based on the existence of the foregoing conditions, the Parties agree to the following articles:

ARTICLE I: DEFINITIONS

As used in this Agreement, the following expressions shall have the following meanings:

A. The "Agreement" is this Agreement, which shall be referred to as the Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement ("SMAA").





- B. The "Division" is the Florida Division of Emergency Management.
- C. A "Requesting Party" to this Agreement is a Participating Party who requests assistance under this agreement.
- D. An "Assisting Party" to this Agreement is a Participating Party who provides assistance to a Requesting Party under this agreement.
- E. The "Period of Assistance" is the time during which an Assisting Party renders assistance to a Requesting Party under this agreement and includes the time necessary for the resources and personnel of the Assisting Party to travel to the place specified by the Requesting Party and the time necessary to return to their place of origin.
- F. A "Mission" is a documented emergency response activity performed during a Period of Assistance, usually in reference to one operational function or activity.
- G. A "local government" is any educational district, special district, or any entity that is a "local governmental entity" within the meaning of section 11.45(1)(g), *Florida Statutes*.
- H. An "educational district" is any school district within the meaning of section 1001.30, *Florida Statutes*, and any Florida College System Institution or State University within the meaning of section 1000.21, *Florida Statutes*.
- I. A "special district" is any local or regional governmental entity which is an independent special district within the meaning of section 189.012(3), *Florida Statutes*, established by local, special, or general act, or by rule, ordinance, resolution, or interlocal agreement.
- J. A "tribal council" is the respective governing bodies of the Seminole Tribe of Florida and Miccosukee Tribe of Indians recognized as special improvement district by section 285.18(1), *Florida Statutes*.
- K. An "interlocal agreement" is any agreement between local governments within the meaning of section 163.01(3)(a), *Florida Statutes*.
- L. A "Resource Support Agreement" as used in this Agreement refers to a supplemental agreement of support between a Requesting Party and an Assisting Party.
- M. "Proof of work" as used in this Agreement refers to original and authentic documentation of a single individual or group of individuals' emergency response activity at a tactical level.

- N. "Proof of payment" as used in this Agreement refers to original and authentic documentation of an emergency response expenditure made by an Assisting Party.
- O. A "Reimbursement Package" as used in this Agreement refers to a full account of mission response documentation supported by proof of work and proof of payment.
- P. Any expressions not assigned definitions elsewhere in this Agreement shall have the definitions assigned them by the Emergency Management Act, Chapter 252, *Florida Statutes*.

ARTICLE II: APPLICABILITY OF THE AGREEMENT

Any Participating Party, including the Division, may request assistance under this Agreement for a "major disaster" or "catastrophic disaster" as defined in section 252.34, *Florida Statutes*, minor disasters, and other such emergencies as lawfully determined by a Participating Party.

ARTICLE III: INVOCATION OF THE AGREEMENT

In the event of an emergency or anticipated emergency, a Participating Party may request assistance under this Agreement from any other Participating Party or the Division if, in the judgement of the Requesting Party, its own resources are inadequate to meet the needs of the emergency or disaster.

- A. Any request for assistance under this Agreement may be oral, but within five (5) calendar days must be confirmed in writing by the Requesting Party. All requests for assistance under this Agreement shall be transmitted by the Requesting Party to another Participating Party or the Division. If the Requesting Party transmits its request for Assistance directly to a Participating Party other than the Division, the Requesting Party and Assisting Party shall keep the Division advised of their activities.
- B. The Division shall relay any requests for assistance under this Agreement to such other Participating Parties as it may deem appropriate and coordinate the activities of the Assisting Parties to ensure timely assistance to the Requesting Party. All such activities shall be carried out in accordance with the State's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.

ARTICLE IV: RESPONSIBILITIES OF REQUESTING PARTIES

To the extent practicable, all Requesting Parties shall provide the following information to their respective county emergency management agency, the Division, and the intended Assisting Party or Parties. In providing such information, Requesting Parties should utilize Section I of the





Resource Support Agreement (RSA) Form, available via the <u>Division approved</u> <u>documents site</u>¹.

- A. A description of the Mission to be performed by the Assisting Party;
- B. A description of the resources and capabilities needed to complete the Mission successfully;
- C. The location, date, and time personnel and resources from the Assisting Party should arrive at the incident site, staging area, facility, or other location designated by the Requesting Party;
- D. A description of the health, safety, and working conditions expected for deploying personnel;
- E. Lodging and meal availability;
- F. Any logistical requirements;
- G. A description of any location or facility outside the territorial jurisdiction of the Requesting Party needed to stage incoming resources and personnel;
- H. The location date, and time for personnel of the Requesting Party to meet and receive the personnel and equipment of the Assisting Party; and
- I. A technical description of any communications equipment needed to ensure effective information sharing between the Requesting Party, any Assisting Parties, and all relevant responding entities.

ARTICLE V: RESPONSIBILITIES OF ASSISTING PARTIES

Each Party shall render assistance under this Agreement to any Requesting Party to the extent practicable that its personnel, equipment, resources, and capabilities can render assistance. If upon receiving a request for assistance under this Agreement a Party determines that it has the capacity to render some or all of such assistance, it shall provide the following information without delay to the Requesting Party, the Division, and the Assisting Party's County emergency management agency. In providing such information, the Assisting Party should utilize the Section II of the Resource Support Agreement (RSA) Form, available via the Division approved documents site.

- A. A description of the personnel, equipment, supplies, services and capabilities it has available, together with a description of the qualifications of any skilled personnel;
- B. An estimate of the time such personnel, equipment, supplies, and services will continue to be available;
- C. An estimate of the time it will take to deliver such personnel, equipment, supplies, and services to the location(s) specified by the Requesting Party;
- D. A technical description of any communications and telecommunications equipment available for timely communications with the Requesting Party and other Assisting Parties;
- E. The names and contact information of all personnel whom the Assisting Party has designated as team leaders or supervisors; and
- F. An estimated cost for the provision of assistance.

ARTICLE VI: RENDITION OF ASSISTANCE

The Requesting Party shall afford the emergency response personnel of all Assisting Parties, while operating within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Requesting Party, the same powers, duties, rights, and privileges, except that of arrest unless specifically authorized by the Requesting Party, as are afforded the equivalent emergency response personnel of the Requesting Party. Emergency response personnel of the Assisting Party will remain under the command and control of the Assisting Party, but during the Period of Assistance, the resources and responding personnel of the Assisting Party will perform response activities under the operational and tactical control of the Requesting Party.

A. Unless otherwise agreed upon between the Requesting and Assisting Party, the Requesting Party shall be responsible for providing food, water, and shelter to the personnel of the Assisting Party. For Missions performed in areas where there are insufficient resources to support responding personnel and equipment throughout the Period of Assistance, the Assisting Party shall, to the fullest extent practicable, provide their emergency response personnel with the equipment, fuel, supplies, and technical resources necessary to make them self-sufficient throughout the Period of Assistance, the Requesting Party may specify that Assisting Parties send only self-sufficient personnel and resources but must specify the length of time self-sufficiency should be maintained.

- B. Unless the Requesting Party has specified the contrary, it shall, to the fullest extent practicable, coordinate all communications between its personnel and the responding personnel of the Assisting Parties, and shall determine and share the frequencies and other technical specifications of all communications equipment to be used, as appropriate, with the deployed personnel of the Assisting Parties.
- C. Personnel of the Assisting Party who render assistance under this Agreement shall receive the usual wages, salaries, and other compensation as are normally afforded to personnel for emergency response activities within their home jurisdiction, and shall have all the immunities, rights, interests, and privileges applicable to their normal employment. If personnel of the Assisting Party hold local licenses or certifications limited to the jurisdiction of issue, then the Requesting Party shall recognize and honor those licenses or certifications for the duration of the Period of Assistance.

ARTICLE VII: REIMBURSEMENT

After the Period of Assistance has ended, the Assisting Party shall have 45 days to develop a full reimbursement package for services rendered and resources supplied during the Period of Assistance. All expenses claimed to the Requesting Party must have been incurred in direct response to the emergency as requested by the Requesting Party and must be supported by proof of work and proof of payment.

To guide the proper documentation and accountability of expenses, the Assisting Party should utilize the Claim Summary Form, available via the <u>Division approved documents site</u> as a guide and summary of expense to collect information to then be formally submitted for review by the Requesting Party.

To receive reimbursement for assistance provided under this agreement, the Assisting Party shall provide, at a minimum, the following supporting documentation to the Requesting Party unless otherwise agreed upon between the Requesting and Assisting Parties:

- A. A complete and authentic description of expenses incurred by the Assisting Party during the Period of Assistance;
- B. Copy of a current and valid Internal Revenue Service W-9 Form;
- C. Copies of all relevant payment and travel policies in effect during the Period of Assistance;
- D. Daily personnel activity logs demonstrating emergency response activities performed for all time claimed (for FDEM reimbursement Division approved activity logs will be required for personnel activity claims);





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- E. Official payroll and travel reimbursement records for all claimed personnel expenses;
- F. Neat and comprehensive fringe benefit calculations for each position class or category of claimed personnel;
- G. Written justification for all additional expenses/purchases incurred during the Period of Assistance;
- H. Proof of payment for additional/miscellaneous expenses incurred during the Period of Assistance
- I. Equipment activity logs demonstrating equipment use and operation in support of emergency response activities for all time claimed (for FDEM reimbursement Division approved forms will be required for equipment activity claims);
- J. Proof of reimbursement to all employees who incurred emergency response expenses with personal money;
- K. Justification for equipment repair expenses; and
- L. Copies of any applicable supporting agreements or contracts with justification.

If a dispute or disagreement regarding the eligibility of any expense arises, the Requesting Party, Assisting Party, or the Division may elect binding arbitration. If binding arbitration is elected, the Parties must select as an arbitrator any elected official of another Participating Party, or any other official of another Participating Party whose normal duties include emergency management, and the other Participating Party shall also select such an official as an arbitrator, and the arbitrators thus chosen shall select another such official as a third arbitrator.

The three (3) arbitrators shall convene by teleconference or videoconference within thirty (30) calendar days to consider any documents and any statements or arguments by the Division, the Requesting Party, or the Assisting Party concerning the protest, and shall render a decision in writing not later than ten (10) business days after the close of the hearing. The decision of a majority of the arbitrators shall bind the parties and shall be final.

If the Participating Parties do not elect binding arbitration, this agreement and any disputes arising thereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida and venue shall be in Leon County, Florida. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create an employer-employee relationship or a partnership or joint venture between the participating parties. Furthermore, nothing contained herein shall constitute a waiver by either Party of its sovereign immunity or the provisions of section 768.28, Florida Statutes. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by either Party to be sued by third parties.

ARTICLE VIII: COST ELIGIBLE FOR REIMBURSEMENT

The costs incurred by the Assisting Party under this Agreement shall be reimbursed as needed to make the Assisting Party whole to the fullest extent practicable.

- A. Employees of the Assisting Party who render assistance under this Agreement shall be entitled to receive from the Assisting Party all their usual wages, salaries, and any and all other compensation for mobilization, hours worked, and demobilization. Such compensation shall include any and all contributions for insurance and retirement, and such employees shall continue to accumulate seniority at the usual rate. As between the employees and the Assisting Party, the employees shall have all the duties, responsibilities, immunities, rights, interests, and privileges incident to their usual employment. The Requesting Party shall reimburse the Assisting Party for these costs of employment.
- B. The costs of equipment supplied by the Assisting Party shall be reimbursed at the rental rate established in FEMA's Schedule of Equipment, or at any other rental rate agreed to by the Requesting Party. In order to be eligible for reimbursement, equipment must be in actual operation performing eligible work. The labor costs of the operator are not included in the rates and should be approved separately from equipment costs. The Assisting Party shall pay for fuels, other consumable supplies, and repairs to its equipment as needed to keep the equipment in a state of operational readiness. Rent for the equipment shall be deemed to include the cost of fuel and other consumable supplies, maintenance, service, repairs, and ordinary wear and tear. With the consent of the Assisting Party, the Requesting Party may provide fuels, consumable supplies, maintenance, and repair services for such equipment at the site. In that event, the Requesting Party may deduct the actual costs of such fuels, consumable supplies, maintenance, and services from the total costs otherwise payable to the Assisting Party. If the equipment is damaged while in use under this Agreement and the Assisting Party receives payment for such damage under any contract of insurance, the Requesting Party may deduct such payment from any item or items billed by the Assisting Party for any of the costs for such damage that may otherwise be payable.
- C. The Requesting Party shall pay the total costs for the use and consumption of any and all consumable supplies delivered by the Assisting Party for the Requesting Party under this Agreement. In the case of perishable supplies, consumption shall be deemed to include normal deterioration, spoilage, and damage notwithstanding the exercise of reasonable care in its storage and use. Supplies remaining unused shall be returned to the Assisting Party in usable condition upon the close of the Period of Assistance, and the Requesting Party may deduct the cost of such returned supplies from the total costs billed by the Assisting Party for such supplies. If the Assisting Party agrees, the Requesting Party may also replace any and all used consumable supplies with like





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supplies in usable condition and of like grade, quality and quantity within the time allowed for reimbursement under this Agreement.

D. The Assisting Party shall keep records to document all assistance rendered under this Agreement. Such records shall present information sufficient to meet the audit requirements specified in the regulations of FEMA and any applicable circulars issued by the State of Florida. Upon reasonable notice, the Assisting Party shall make its records available the Requesting Party for inspection or duplication between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on all weekdays, except for official holidays.

ARTICLE IX: INSURANCE

Each Participating Party shall determine for itself what insurance to procure, if any. With the exceptions in this Article, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require any Participating Party to procure insurance.

- A. Each Participating Party shall procure employers' insurance meeting the requirements of the Workers' Compensation Act, as amended, affording coverage for any of its employees who may be injured while performing any activities under the authority of this Agreement, and shall be provided to each Participating Party.
- B. Any Participating Party that elects additional insurance affording liability coverage for any activities that may be performed under the authority of this Agreement shall be provided to each Participating Party.
- C. Subject to the limits of such liability insurance as any Participating Party may elect to procure, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to waive, in whole or in part, any immunity any Participating Party may have in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding.
- D. Each Participating Party which renders assistance under this Agreement shall be deemed to stand in the relation of an independent contractor to all other Participating Parties and shall not be deemed to be the agent of any other Participating Party.
- E. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to relieve any Participating Party of liability for its own conduct and that of its employees.
- F. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to obligate any Participating Party to indemnify any other Participating Party from liability to third parties.

ARTICLE X: GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary elsewhere in this Agreement, all Participating Parties shall be subject to the following requirements in the performance of this Agreement:

- A. All Participating Parties shall allow public access to all documents, papers, letters, or other materials subject to the requirements of the Public Records Act, as amended, and made or received by any Participating Party in conjunction with this Agreement.
- B. No Participating Party may hire employees in violation of the employment restrictions in the Immigration and Nationality Act, as amended.
- C. No costs reimbursed under this Agreement may be used directly or indirectly to influence legislation or any other official action by the Legislature of the State of Florida or any of its agencies.
- D. Any communication to the Division under this Agreement shall be sent via either email, the Division of Emergency Managements Enterprise System (DEMES), or mail to the Response Bureau, Florida Division of Emergency Management, 2555 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2100.
- E. Any communication to a Participating Party shall be sent to the official or officials specified by that Participating Party. For the purpose of this section, any such communication may be sent by the U.S. Mail, e-mail, or other electronic platforms.

ARTICLE XI: EFFECTS OF AGREEMENT

Upon its execution by a Participating Party, this Agreement shall have the following effect with respect to that Participating Party:

- A. The execution of this Agreement by any Participating Party which is a signatory to the Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement of 1994 shall terminate the rights, interests, duties, responsibilities, and obligations of that Participating Party under the Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement of 1994, but such termination shall not affect the liability of the Participating Party for the reimbursement of any costs due under the Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement of 1994, regardless of whether such costs are billed or unbilled.
- B. The execution of this Agreement by any Participating Party which is a signatory to the Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement shall terminate the rights, interests, duties, responsibilities and obligations of that Participating Party under the Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement, but such termination shall not affect the liability of the Participating Party for the reimbursement of any costs due under the Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement,

regardless of whether such costs are billed or unbilled.

- C. Upon the activation of this Agreement by the Requesting Party, this Agreement shall supersede any other existing agreement between it and any Assisting Party to the extent that the former may be inconsistent with the latter.
- D. Upon its execution by any Participating Party, this Agreement will continue in effect for one (1) year from its date of execution by that Participating Party, and it shall automatically renew each year after its execution, unless within sixty (60) calendar days before the renewal date the Participating Party notifies the Division, in writing, of its intent to withdraw from the Agreement.
- E. The Division shall transmit any amendment to this Agreement by sending the amendment to all Participating Parties not later than five (5) business days after its execution by the Division. Such amendment shall take effect not later than sixty (60) calendar days after the date of its execution by the Division and shall then be binding on all Participating Parties. Notwithstanding the preceding sentence, any Participating Party who objects to the amendment may withdraw from the Agreement by notifying the Division in writing of its intent to do so within that time in accordance with section E of this Article.
- F. A Participating Party may rescind this Agreement at will after providing the other Participating Party a written SMAA withdrawal notice. Such notice shall be provided at least 30 days prior to the date of withdrawal. This 30-day withdrawal notice must be: written, signed by an appropriate authority, duly authorized on the official letterhead of the Participating Party, and must be sent via email, the Division of Emergency Managements Enterprise System (DEMES), or certified mail.

ARTICLE XII: INTERPRETATION AND APPLICATION OF AGREEMENT

The interpretation and application of this Agreement shall be governed by the following conditions:

- A. The obligations and conditions resting upon the Participating Parties under this Agreement are not independent, but dependent.
- B. Time shall be of the essence of this Agreement, and of the performance of all conditions, obligations, duties, responsibilities, and promises under it.
- C. This Agreement states all the conditions, obligations, duties, responsibilities, and promises of the Participating Parties with respect to the subject of this Agreement, and there are no conditions, obligations, duties, responsibilities, or promises other than those expressed in this Agreement.

- D. If any sentence, clause, phrase, or other portion of this Agreement is ruled unenforceable or invalid, every other sentence, clause, phrase, or other portion of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, it being the intent of the Division and the other Participating Parties that every portion of the Agreement shall be severable from every other portion to the fullest extent practicable. The Division reserves the right, at its sole and absolute discretion, to change, modify, add, or remove portions of any sentence, clause, phrase, or other portion of this Agreement that conflicts with state law, regulation, or policy. If the change is minor, the Division will notify the Participating Party of the change and such changes will become effective immediately; therefore, please check these terms periodically for changes. If the change is substantive, the Participating Parties may be required to execute the Agreement with the adopted changes. Any continued or subsequent use of this Agreement following the posting of minor changes to this Agreement shall signify implied acceptance of such changes.
- E. The waiver of any obligation or condition in this Agreement by a Participating Party shall not be construed as a waiver of any other obligation or condition in this Agreement.

NOTE: This iteration of the State of Florida Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement will replace all previous versions.

The Division shall provide reimbursement to Assisting Parties in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Article for missions performed at the direct request of the Division. Division reimbursement eligible expenses must be in direct response to the emergency as requested by the State of Florida. All required cost estimations and claims must be executed through the DEMES Mutual Aid Portal and assisting agencies must use all required <u>FDEM forms</u> for documentation and cost verification. If a Requesting Party has not forwarded a request through the Division, or if an Assisting Party has rendered assistance without being requested to do so by the Division, the Division shall not be liable for the costs of any such assistance.

FDEM reserves the right to deny individual reimbursement requests if deemed to not be in direct response to the incident for which asset was requested.

SUBJECT: Consideration for Approval an Interlocal Agreement between the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, Flagler County School Board, Flagler County Sheriff's Office, and the City of Bunnell for the Maintenance and Operation of the George Washington Carver Community Center.

DATE OF MEETING: March 4, 2024

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: At the December 18, 2023, Regular Meeting under item 7i Commissioners approved this ILA. However, it was brought before the School Board for approval, and they modified some of the terms of the agreement to clarify the roles of the parties. The School Board and the Sheriff have approved the ILA as presented with this agenda. Bunnell is scheduled to consider it on February 26, after this County Commission agenda is published.

The Flagler County Board of County Commissioners and the Flagler School Board have worked together for decades to make the George Washington Carver Community Center a vibrant and wholesome educational and recreational facility for the youth and citizens of Flagler County.

Working in collaboration with our community partners, to further improve and enhance the many offerings, programs and services being provided at the Carver Center, a formal working group was created. Over the past several months, this formal working group – which includes staff members from Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, Flagler School Board, Flagler Sheriff's Office, City of Bunnell, George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board and a member of the public – have been meeting to work through the development of an Interlocal Agreement and have been gathering feedback to ensure that all voices from the community were taken into consideration.

This updated agreement formalizes the participation and funding of four government agencies and the George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board which are all dedicated and supportive of the continued success of the George Washington Carver Community Center.

This interlocal agreement was presented to the George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board on November 27, 2023, and received their vote of support to move it forward for consideration by our respective boards.

STRATEGIC PLAN:

- Focus Areas: Growth and Infrastructure
 - Objective: GI-3.3: Expand and enhance options for cultural, leisure and recreational activities.

FUNDING INFORMATION: Funding related to the George Washington Carver Community Center annual operating budget would be shared by the four agencies listed, as well as the G.W. Carver Foundation (see chart, pg. 20). Expenses to be paid by Flagler County for FY24 total \$162,991. Through the attached interlocal agreement, \$97,500 will be provided to the School Board annually to cover their staffing/programming for the George Washington Carver Community Center. The remaining \$65,491 would be used to cover the operational costs (i.e., utilities and maintenance) and paid through Flagler County – General Services Department.

INTERLOCAL BETWEEN FLAGLER COUNTY, THE FLAGLER COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT, FLAGLER COUNTY SHERIFF, AND CITY OF BUNNELL REGARDING THE GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER COMMUNITY CENTER

THIS INTERLOCAL AND FACILITY USE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into between the Board of County Commissioners of Flagler County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), the Flagler County School District, an agency of the Florida State government ("School Board"), the Flagler County Sheriff, a constitutional officer of the State of Florida ("Sheriff"), and the City of Bunnell, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of Florida ("City"), hereafter referred to together as the "Parties".

WHEREAS, the School Board and the County have worked together for over forty years to make the George Washington Carver Community Center (the "Carver Center"), currently owned by the County, and located in the City of Bunnell, a vibrant and wholesome educational and recreational facility for the youth and citizens of Flagler County; and

WHEREAS, the Parties work together on a variety of community services and joint use of facilities to include a 2011 interlocal agreement for the Carver Center whereby the School Board was responsible for the daily operations of the facility supported by annual financial contributions of the County (the "Carver Center ILA"); and

WHEREAS, in 2015, the School Board and the County amended the Carver Center ILA to increase the annual financial contribution of the County toward the facility's operations; and

WHEREAS, the Parties remain concerned with our youth and citizens in general and both the School Board and the County are facing severe financial pressures requiring creative solutions; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is intended to document the respective obligations of the Parties in implementing the cooperative proposal and shall supersede and replace the Carver Center ILA, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Parties will utilize the Carver Center facilities for the education and recreational enjoyment of the residents of Flagler County as outlined herein; and

WHEREAS, Section 163.01, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1969," authorizes local governmental units to make the most efficient use of their powers by enabling them to cooperate with public agencies on a basis of mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities in a manner and pursuant to forms of governmental organization that will accord best with geographic, economic, population and other factors influencing the needs and development of local communities; and

WHEREAS, the County has broad home rule and proprietary powers pursuant to Article VII, Sec. 1(a), Florida Constitution, and Section 125.01, Florida Statutes, to provide, maintain and license the use of County buildings for the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the School Board desires to use the Carver Center as an educational facility pursuant to Section 1013.15(2)(a), Florida Statutes, and to manage it to serve its educational purposes and secondarily to fulfill the social and recreational needs of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff is committed to providing safe and structured athletic programs to the youth of Flagler County. These programs are available to all youth in Flagler County regardless of their race, color, religion, sex, gender, disability, or financial situation. The mission of Flagler Sheriff's Office is to foster educational programs and activities that will increase student and community knowledge of the function of law enforcement and to serve as mentors and positive role models for the Flagler County youth; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the above matters and the mutual covenants, promises and representations herein, the Parties hereto enter into this Interlocal and Facility Use Agreement to govern the operation, maintenance and future alterations or improvements to the Carver Center and related facilities as follows:

I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF FLAGLER COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD

- A. The School Board will be solely responsible for the daily operation of the areas of the Carver Center identified as "School Board" space, and the areas of the Carver Center identified as "joint/community" space, in Attachment A, attached hereto, and incorporated herein. Daily operation of the Center includes educational staffing, recreational programming and management.
- **B.** The School Board will be responsible for the overall management of the facility to include scheduler/tool (i.e., Facilitron) for the entire facility.
- C. The School Board may also utilize the assistance of other partners with programming activities which may include outside non-profit groups, private vendors, volunteers, and other groups.
- D. Volunteers, as defined in SB Policy 313 shall follow the standard operating procedure of the School Board in obtaining clearance to participate in assigned duties sponsored by the School Board.

Carver Center Interlocal Agreement

- E. School Board agrees to operate its areas of the Carver Center identified in Attachment A including any buildings, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment or placed upon the premises, in a good state of repair and order, except any ordinary wear and tear arising from use under this Agreement. The School Board agrees not to strip, waste, or neglect any building, furnishing, fixture, or equipment. The School Board shall obtain the prior written permission of the County for any alterations requiring a building permit.
- F. Annually, the School Board shall provide funding for the Carver Center in the amount of \$10,000. Payments to Flagler County annually by October 1.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF FLAGLER COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

- A. Flagler County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) will be responsible for the daily operation of the portions of the Carver Center identified as exclusive FCSO space in Attachment A. Daily operation of the Carver Center by FCSO includes athletic staffing, mentoring, programming and management.
- **B.** Volunteers shall obtain clearance (i.e., background check) to participate in assigned duties sponsored by FCSO.
- C. Recreational activities will be scheduled on the School Board programming scheduler (i.e., Facilitron).
- **D.** The Sheriff shall ensure programs will be available to all youth in Flagler County regardless of their race, color, religion, sex, gender, disability or financial situation.
- E. The Sheriff agrees to operate its areas of the Carver Center identified in Attachment A including any buildings, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment or placed upon the premises, in a good state of repair and order, except any ordinary wear and tear arising from use under this Agreement. The Sheriff agrees not to strip, waste, or neglect any building, furnishing, fixture, or equipment. The Sheriff shall obtain the prior written permission of the County for any alterations requiring a building permit.
- F. Annually, the Sheriff shall provide funding for the Carver Center in the amount of \$10,000. Payments to Flagler County annually by October 1.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY OF BUNNELL

- A. Annually, the City shall provide funding for the Carver Center in the amount of \$10,000. Payments to Flagler County annually by October 1.
- **B.** As part of the annual budget process approved by the City Commission of Bunnell, the City may unilaterally increase the amount detailed in this Section III. without further amendment to this Agreement.

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF FLAGLER COUNTY

- A. Annually, the County shall provide funding for the George Washington Carver Community Center in the amount of \$97,500. Payments to the School Board shall be made quarterly in equal installments within ten days following July 1, October 1, January 1, and April 1.
- B. County will also pay facility utility, maintenance (including building/equipment repairs), pest/termite control, custodial costs, and other consumable supplies (i.e., light bulbs, hand towels, soap, and toilet paper) necessary for the Carver Center, only as funding permits and subject to the annual budgeting process of the County.
- **C.** The County shall act as fiscal agent in addition to developing an overall budget for facility upkeep with input from the School Board, City of Bunnell and Sheriff.
- D. As part of the annual budget process approved by the Board of County Commissioners, the County may unilaterally increase the amount detailed in this Section IV without further amendment to this Agreement.
- E. Capital Outlay for maintenance, and replacement of equipment and facilities may be considered during the annual budget process.

V. SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES OF SCHOOL BOARD AND SHERIFF

- A. The School Board and the Sheriff will share the responsibility of developing operational programming and identifying activities to occur in the joint/community space (Attachment "A") at the facility with input from the Carver Advisory Committee as defined in Attachment "B".
- **B.** Programming/Activities will address periods when school is both in and out of session to include all scheduled programs and activities.
- C. School Board and Sheriff agree to meet at a minimum semi-annually to discuss scheduling and use of the Carver Center to prevent duplication of services and ensure space availability. This does not prevent either Party from requesting additional facility usage to accommodate unknown event(s) arising during each six-month period.
- D. The School Board and Sheriff recognize there may be unknown community event(s) arising during each six-month period that may need to take precedence over the regular usage by either the School Board and/or Sheriff. In these circumstances the School Board and Sheriff will make every effort to accommodate these events.

VI. JOINT PARTY RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The Parties agree to work together on obtaining and implementing facility and programming grants that will insure to the benefit the youth and community using of the Carver Center.
- B. The establishment of use of facility fees for outside entities (i.e. Non School Board or Non Sheriff related events) of the Carver Center will require approval of the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC), the method of collection, method of accounting and the subsequent expenditure of fees for use of the Carver Center or participation in activities that occur at the facility shall be developed by the BOCC or County with input from the School Board and Carver Advisory Committee. Such fees shall generally be designed to offset programming costs, and facility/maintenance costs.
- C. Revenue generated at or by the Carver Center and related facilities shall be used to defray costs of the School Board and County in implementing this Agreement and otherwise to upgrade the facility and/or furnishings/equipment. The School Board and Sheriff will use generally accepted accounting methods to provide the

County with an annual report to the satisfaction of the County of amounts of revenue generated and expended at the Carver Center respectively. Such reports shall be provided each January and will cover the preceding calendar year. The County reserves the right to inspect the records of the School Board and Sheriff relating to the Carver Center under this Agreement with reasonable notice.

- D. In the spirit of co-sponsorship for both recreational and educational services to the community, the School Board, City of Bunnell, Sheriff and County may agree to modify and enhance the future Carver Center facilities and operations. The staff of the Parties shall be empowered to work out the day-to-day operational details of this Agreement.
- E. All claims, disputes, and other matters in question between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof shall be mediated among the School Superintendent, the County Administrator, the Sheriff, and the Bunnell City Manager, or their respective designees, in good faith before being referred to their respective boards.
- F. All employees and volunteers shall immediately report any suspicious activity to Dispatch at (386) 313-4911 for non-emergencies, 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency, or any Bunnell Police Officer or Flagler County Sheriff's Deputy onsite.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. Term. The initial term of this Agreement shall be for five years and shall continue from year to year thereafter unless terminated by a Party in accordance with Section VII.B. below.
- B. Termination. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect unless terminated by any Party. To terminate, any Party may give notice to terminate this Agreement without cause with one (1) year advance notice in accordance with Section VII. J. below.
- C. Lawful Use. The Parties agree that they shall not use any of the above-described premises or any part thereof in any unlawful, improper, offensive manner contrary to any applicable law, rule or regulation and shall not use the premises in a manner to be injurious to any person or property or to endanger or affect any insurance on the Carver Center and related facilities or to increase the premium thereof.

- **D. Insurance.** The Parties agree to maintain, at no cost to the others, adequate liability insurance covering their respective employees, officers, or agents and their activities under this Agreement against exposure to judgments that are within the limits of the waiver of sovereign immunity established by the State of Florida.
- E. Indemnification. The Parties agree that each will defend, indemnify and save the other harmless from claims or actions of any nature arising out of the use of the Carver Center under this Agreement due to the negligent or wrongful acts of its own employees, officers, or agents, including volunteers, or due to its negligent or wrongful operation of equipment, provided however that this section shall not be construed as waiving any party's right of sovereign immunity beyond the scope and limitations of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or as waiving any other defense or limitation which any of the parties may have against any claim or cause of action by any person not a party to this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as a consent by any party to be sued by third parties.
- F. Transfer/Assignment. The Parties shall not allow or permit any transfer, assignment, or other use to be made of this Agreement, except as prescribed herein, without first obtaining the written consent of the other Parties.
- **G. Amendment.** This Agreement may be modified or revised at any time by a written instrument executed by authorized representatives of the Parties.
- H. Delegation. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to authorize the delegation of the constitutional or statutory duty of the Parties or their officers. The Parties reserve the right to exercise their functions under this Agreement through their respective designated delegates, representatives, or agents.
- I. Effective Date. This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by all Parties and filing with the Flagler County Clerk of Circuit Court.
- J. Notices. All notices provided under or pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing, delivered either by hand or by first class, certified mail, return receipt requested, to the representatives identified below at the address set forth below:

- K. No Property Interest. This is an Interlocal Agreement and a Use Agreement. Nothing herein is intended to transfer a property interest of any nature whatsoever by the County to the other Parties or third parties, including without limitation a lease or easement interest.
- L. Severability. The validity of any portion, article, section, paragraph, provision, clause, or any portion thereof of this Agreement shall have no effect upon the validity of any other part or portion hereof.
- M. Third Party Beneficiaries. Nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than the Parties. All duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the Parties and not for the benefit of any other party.
- N. Force Majeure. No party shall be considered in default in the performance of its obligations hereunder to the extent that performance of such obligations, or any of them, is delayed or prevented by force majeure. Force majeure shall include, but

not be limited to, hostility, revolution, civil commotion, strike, epidemic, fire, flood, wind, earthquake, terrorism, hurricane, explosion, any emergency declaration under state law, or any act of God or any cause whether of the same or different nature, existing or future; provided that the cause whether or not enumerated in this section is beyond the control and authority and without the fault or negligence of the Party seeking relief under this Section.

O. Ability to Obligate. Each Party hereto represents to the others that it has undertaken all necessary actions to execute this Agreement, and that it has the legal authority to enter into this Agreement and to undertake all obligations imposed on it.

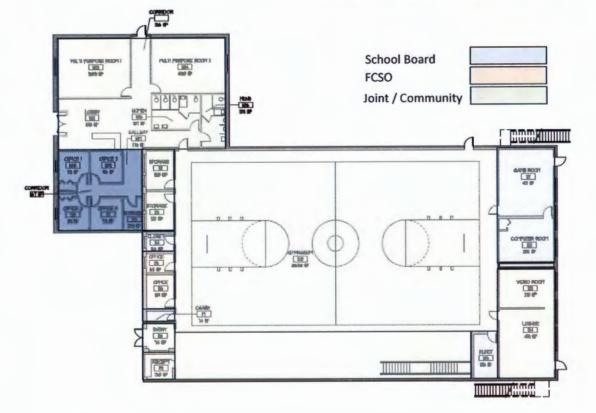

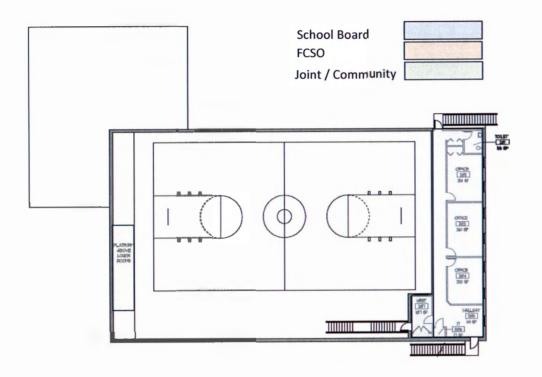

School Board of Flagler County

The School Board and the County have worked together for over forty years to make the George Washington Carver Community Center (the "Carver Center"), currently owned by the County, and located in the City of Bunnell, a vibrant and wholesome educational and recreational facility for the youth and citizens of Flagler. This beneficial shared experience has afforded us the opportunity to evaluate the daily operations of the George Washington Carver Community Center and feel that a similar agreement could be reached between the parties for the facility moving forward. Specifics related to the responsibilities of the parties will be spelled out in more detail in an interlocal agreement.

George Washington Carver Foundation -501(c)(3)

A community support organization known as the George Washington Carver Foundation has been established. The purpose of this foundation is to facilitate community relationships and awareness of the center while promoting programs to local residents. The foundation's 501(c)(3) status would assist with the solicitation and attainment of additional financial resources that otherwise would be unavailable. In addition, a member of the foundation will also serve on the Advisory Committee.

George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Committee

The future governance of the George Washington Carver Community Center will be based in part on funding organizations and part on community representation. In an effort to provide a good cross-section of representation, the table below is an example of how the Advisory Committee of the George Washington Carver Community Center could look.

The purpose of the George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Committee will be to advise the School Board on the needs and delivery of services at the George Washington Carver Community Center. Each of the representatives would be able to have a voice to ensure that the needs of their respective constituents are being met at the Center. The managing entity of the George Washington Carver Community Center will receive feedback and guidance from the Advisory Committee during regularly scheduled meetings.

Funding

Many discussions have taken place regarding the future funding for the Center. Firm commitments have been made by several partners that will provide for the complete operational funding over the next five years.

These costs would then be shared by a variety of center partners to minimize the financial impact to any single entity. As expenditures increase each funding partner shall increase proportionally. The table below is an example of how the center would be funded.

Community Center Operations

The George Washington Carver Community Center operational hours would be extended to operate from 9:00am -9:00pm, Monday – Friday, with special events being held on weekends and holidays. Specific detailed operational hours would be designed to meet all community members' needs, as well as utilize the overall facility. Semi-annually School Board and FCSO in collaboration will develop a schedule for the following semester.

During the summer, the George Washington Carver Community Center will host a variety of summer camps, for area youth. Weekends and holidays would be set aside to schedule as needed special events.

The Carver Community Center programs would include a continuum of after school, youth development activities and family support services that engage children from youth to adulthood while providing necessary support for their families.

Creation of Additional Programming

In working with our partners additional programming could be offered at the center to meet the socioeconomic and other needs of the community.

With the management of the Center by the School Board, additional programming would be developed for extended holidays during the school year such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Spring Break. These may include extended center hours for youth, sports camps, and holiday festivities. Still more would be developed for summer break to mimic the activities being provided at the George Washington Carver Community Center. These would consist of the summer food program and youth camps which may include field trips. Other programming could be developed for weekends. This could be done by non-profits and/or church groups that run special programs at the center or do neighborhood out reach.

SUBJECT: Consideration for Approval an Interlocal Agreement between the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, Flagler County School Board, Flagler County Sheriff's Office, and the City of Bunnell for the Maintenance and Operation of the George Washington Carver Community Center.

DATE OF MEETING: December 18, 2023

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: The Flagler County Board of County Commissioners and the Flagler School Board have worked together for decades to make the George Washington Carver Community Center a vibrant and wholesome educational and recreational facility for the youth and citizens of Flagler County.

Working in collaboration with our community partners, in an attempt to further improve and enhance the many offerings, programs and services being provided at the Carver Center, a formal working group was created. Over the past several months, this formal working group – which includes staff members from Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, Flagler School Board, Flagler Sheriff's Office, City of Bunnell, George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board and a member of the public – have been meeting to work through the development of an Interlocal Agreement and have been gathering feedback to ensure that all voices from the community were taken into consideration.

This updated agreement formalizes the participation and funding of four government agencies and the George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board which are all dedicated and supportive of the continued success of the George Washington Carver Community Center.

This interlocal agreement was presented to the George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board on November 27, 2023, and received their vote of support to move it forward for consideration by our respective boards.

STRATEGIC PLAN:

· Focus Areas: Growth and Infrastructure

 Objective: GI-3.3: Expand and enhance options for cultural, leisure and recreational activities.

FUNDING INFORMATION: Funding related to the George Washington Carver Community Center annual operating budget would be shared by the four agencies listed, as well as the G.W. Carver Foundation (see chart, pg. 20). Expenses to be paid by Flagler County BoCC for FY24 total \$162,991. Through the attached interlocal agreement, \$97,500 will be provided to the School Board annually to cover their staffing/programming for the George Washington Carver Community Center. The remaining \$65,491 would be used to cover the operational costs (i.e., utilities and maintenance) and paid through Flagler County – General Services Department.

DEPARTMENT CONTACT: Administration - Jorge Salinas, Deputy County Administrator

RECOMMENDATION: Recommend the Board approve the Interlocal Agreement between Flagler County Board of County Commissioners, Flagler County School Board, Flagler County Shenff's Office, and the City of Bunnell for the maintenance and operation of the George Washington Carver Community Center.

Jorge Salinas, Deputy County Administrator, started the discussion with the timeline of events bringing each entity into the ILA. Also listed each member of the ILA team and who they represent. Added as of November 2023, there was a general consensus to move forward with the ILA to bring it to each respective board so it would be placed in effect come January 2024. Stated he received an email from the School Board with some changes they wanted to incorporate into the ILA and he informed them that there is a process in place and the George Washington Carver Community Center Advisory Board had already approved the ILA as it was.

Chair Dance stated there was a comment about who manages the activities that go on inside the center since it was his understanding that it has always been the School Board.

Mr. Salinas answered yes, that is his understanding as well. Added the School Board would continue to manage the education piece of the center and the Sheriff through PAL would bring in additional sports.

Chair Dance stated the Sheriff may provide information about what PAL will bring to the center and their fundraising capabilities.

Chair Dance opened public comment.

Daisy Henry, Flagler County Resident, shared concerns regarding the ILA.

Thomas Hudson, Flagler County Resident, asked this item to be tabled so that the people who actually use the center can have a say in how it's used.

Sheriff Staly, Flagler County Sheriff, stated it is their intent to be a partner at the Carver Center to improve their opportunities. Added it is not their goal to take over the center or to turn it into a substation. Stated in the agreement the Sheriff's office commits \$10,000 annually to the center.

Chief Williams, Flagler County Sheriff's Office, reiterated some of what the Sheriff said. Added due to the Sheriff's office being part of the center, there will be additional hours open for the facility.

Commissioner Hansen asked if Chief Williams feels the community was represented in these discussions.

Chief Williams answered yes. Mr. Eric Josey was there to represent the community and does not work for any of the parties involved.

Commissioner Hansen asked if Mr. Ragsdale helped as well.

Chief Williams answered yes.

Chair Dance stated the old governance board has been replaced by an advisory committee that has more teeth now than before as far as guiding, influencing, and programming at the center.

Commissioner Pennington stated this is not a new agreement and it has been in place with the City of Bunnell for years know. Added every year the Carver Center budget is reviewed, and the other entities involved can increase their contribution. Stated this agreement can be terminated at any point without cause with a year notice.

Commissioner Sullivan shared concern if the BOCC approves it, but another entity doesn't, what would happen.

Chair Dance stated any changes would have to come back in front of the boards.

Deputy County Attorney Moylan stated this is the first board to consider the agreement, but if any other boards wanted to make a change it would be brought back in front of the BOCC to ratify.

Commissioner O'Brien shared his respect for Ms. Henry and her leadership.

Chair Dance closed public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hansen to approve Item 7i. Seconded by Commissioner Sullivan.

Chair Dance called the question. Motion carried unanimously.

SUBJECT: Consider Conflict-of-Interest Exemption for Affordable Housing Advisory Committee Member.

DATE OF MEETING: March 4, 2024

OVERVIEW/SUMMARY: Flagler County Housing Services will soon be offering a rental development strategy to make available State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) funding for eligible nonprofit sponsors of affordable housing developments. The rental development funding will be issued in an open, competitive request-for-proposals solicitation (RFP). Ms. Sandra Shank has expressed interest in responding to this solicitation on behalf of the nonprofit agency at which she is executive director. Upon first filling the designated seat on the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (AHAC) as an Advocate for Low Income Persons in 2017, the Commission reappointed Ms. Shank to AHAC on October 4, 2021. Ms. Shank has successfully participated in the AHAC since her initial appointment, having served as Chair and other roles on the committee.

The deemed conflict of interest arises in Ms. Shanks' anticipated application for funding in response to forthcoming Housing Services request for proposals (RFP) for Affordable Rental Development funding while also serving on the AHAC. Considering her close involvement in the projected application, Ms. Shank and staff have determined a conflict of interest presents in both serving on the AHAC and applying for funding under Housing Services under Section 112.313(7), Florida Statutes, which prohibits advisory board members from having an employment or contractual relationship with any business entity that is subject to the regulation of, or doing business with, the County. Considering Florida statutes that restrict conflict of interest of this nature, it has been determined through coordination with County Attorney's Office that Ms. Shank must either 1) resign from the committee, 2) not submit a proposal for the RFP or 3) seek Board exemption from conflict of interest and approve her continued participation on the HAAC through the remainder of her term (10/2/2024). Ms. Shank has requested the Board consider an exemption request, waiving the conflict of interest and allowing her continued appointment to the AHAC.

It should be noted that the AHAC committee makes no decisions on awarding Housing Services funding in general nor for any particular project. This is not a voting conflict of interest for which Ms. Shank could abstain. The AHAC's main and statutorily required role is to complete an annual report of recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC), reviewing 11 development and land development incentives for affordable housing. Similarly, staff have researched and found other communities (i.e., St. Johns County) which have vendors and/or fund awardees serving on their AHAC, with a similar exemption waiver in place.

Section 112.313(12), Florida Statues, authorizes the County Commission, as the appointing body for the AHAC, to waive the prohibitions of Section 112.313(7), Florida Statutes, by an affirmative vote, upon full disclosure of the transaction or relationship giving rise to the conflict.

AHACs and the Code of Ethics

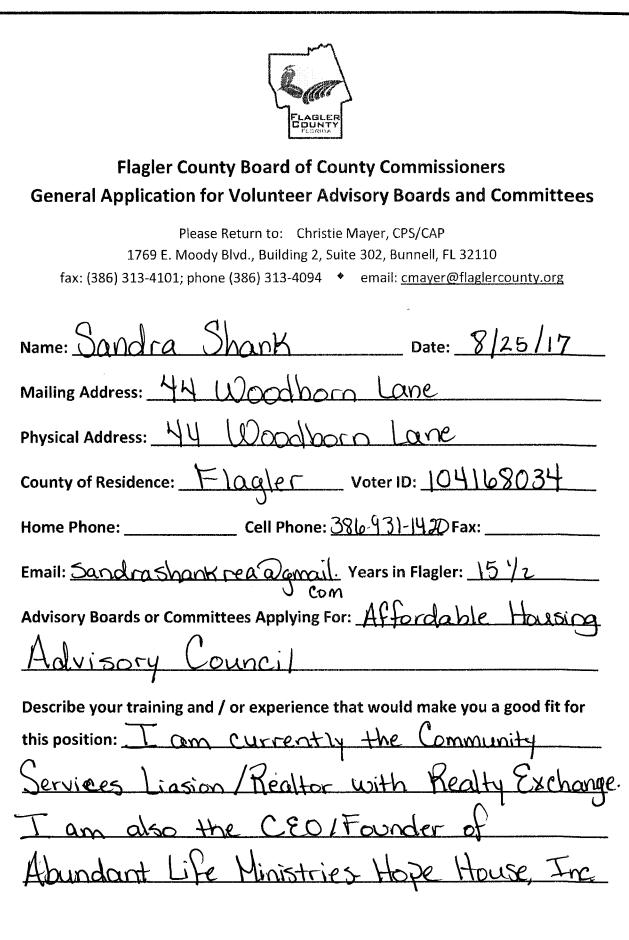
- AHAC members are subject to most of F.S. 112.313 regarding standards of conduct AND F.S. 112.3143 regarding voting conflicts
- Standards of conduct that can be waived for AHAC members. F.S. 112.313(12):
 - Doing business with one's agency
 - Conflicting employment or contractual relationship
- Voting conflicts F.S. 112.3143(4):
 - No appointed AHAC member shall participate in any matter which would inure to the member's **special** private gain or loss; or which the member knows would insure to the gain or loss to the member's employer or relative;
 - UNLESS the member first discloses the nature of his or her interest
- "Special private gain or loss" private interests must be affected to a significantly greater (or lesser) degree than the class of persons affected by the vote



AHACs and the Code of Ethics - Considerations

- If your AHAC makes funding recommendations, be aware of members' potential conflict of interest with their organizations
- If the AHAC is only making land use & incentive recommendations, and the recommendations apply generally to all housing developers & institutions, less risk of a conflict issue
- Reminder: Voting conflict laws only ban special private gain or loss
- When in doubt, disclose the potential conflict & contact your City or County Attorney
