COMMUNITY FIRST

It is with great pleasure that I highlight achievements made during the several weeks since our January brief was published.

First and foremost, I am thrilled to report that we received news of two significant funding milestones. Governor Ron DeSantis awarded \$4 million to Flagler County for its planned "Nexus Center" – a multi-purpose facility to house both a new library and the county's Health and Human Services Department. And the County received a wire transfer in the amount of \$13.6 million from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to cover most of the \$15.74 million local share required by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the beach and dune nourishment project within the City of Flagler Beach.

Our beaches have also been in the news as the County introduced a short, confidential survey on February 12, launched through a text messaging system. Designed to solicit feedback from all residents and businesses, the survey is focused on capturing: how they use the beaches, the value they place on our beaches, and their feelings on a beach nourishment program. Other components of this engagement campaign include printed hand-outs with linked QR code, news releases, social media, and signage.

Civic engagement efforts in the last month included the re-launch of Citizens Academy, our first class since COVID suspended the initiative. Our "Walk-in-the-Park" series offered by Land Management is going strong. The Library hosted a memorable glass-blowing exhibition and put a call out to authors to join our spring Book Fest. And, as you are well aware, the regular schedule of public meetings is quickly expanding to include Board Workshops focused on community concerns, public safety, and the FY2024-25 budget. All of these are open to the public and we encourage our residents to attend.

I would like to express my gratitude to the Board and to every member of our organization for their unwavering commitment to excellence. It is through our collective efforts that we have and will continue to put Flagler F.I.R.S.T

LABOR FORCE RESIDING IN FLAGLER COUNTY




REAL ESTATE
