BETTER TOGETHER

Welcome to your April issue of department metrics and updates.

Infrastructure achievements have included groundbreaking – with the City of Bunnell – for the Commerce Parkway project, a decades-long goal. The Greenways Pedestrian Bridge has been named "Project of the Year" by the Florida chapter of the American Public Works Association. FDOT continues their strong relationship with our Engineering Department, and several locally prioritized, state projects have begun in-county: roundabouts at Cody's Corner and USI/Old Kings Road N; resurfacing on SR100, and the buried seawall near South Central in Flagler Beach.

The work of this Board, our Financial Department, and all staff, to prioritize a fiscally stable position for the county has resulted in an improved S&P financial rating for Flagler County: now AA+. Reserves have grown to \$49 million, or 43% of operating expenditures.

Recent quality-of-life achievements for Flagler County included the acquisition of 10 acres made through the Environmentally Sensitive Lands program, augmenting the public land in preservation at Princess Place. Fire Rescue passed its annual inspection by the Florida Department of Health with flying colors, and was referred to as "outstanding" in the notification letter. The vintage plane expo hosted by Flagler Executive Airport, 'Warbirds over Flagler', drew 4,000 attendees and gets more popular each year.

Community engagement efforts continue. The first 'Flagler County Community Survey' opened through mid-April. Not only will responses inform the Comprehensive Plan Update, 'Flagler2050,' but the data collected from residents will also serve as a benchmark for the county, comparing it to communities that utilize similar surveys.

We accomplish much when we work together: with partner agencies, with partner municipalities, with partner residents – in service to our citizens.

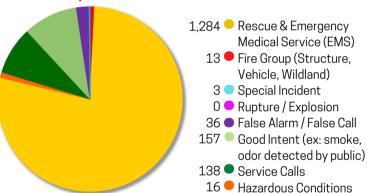

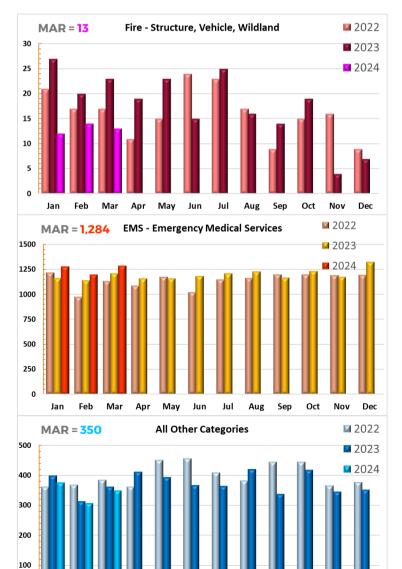

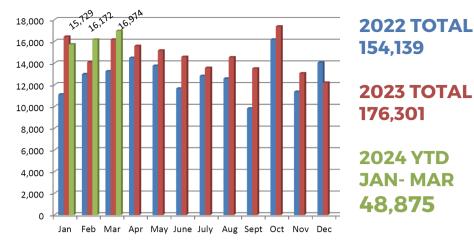

T-HANGAR CONSTRUCTION - In final stage. The S.E. Cline (contractor) and M&M Development & Construction (sub-contractor) are addressing the final remaining punch list items. Airport staff will begin project closeout. April 1 availability for those on waiting list who sign lease. *Project Cost*:\$6,544,136 (90% FDOT, 10% Airport)

AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER EQUIPMENT - Contractor CNCTech has scheduled installation of tower and AWOS sensors in April. Once completed, airport staff will begin project closeout. *Project Cost* \$340,669 (100% FDOT)

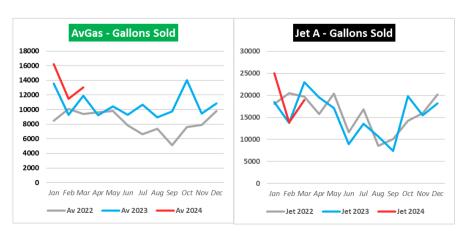
TAXIWAY A - On March 4, 2024, the BoCC accepted an FDOT PTGA to fund new security gate, fencing for main entrance of airfield. This \$100,000 will fund approximately 90% of project. Airport Enterprise will fund \$11,000 balance. The gate, fencing and driveway pavement taking place in April. Anticipate project completion next period. Contractor is finalizing the as-built survey.

Project Cost: \$3,496,125 (90% FAA, 8% FDOT, 2% Airport)

GENERAL AVIATION TERMINAL RAMP - Halifax paved top lift of the ramp. New striping is next. *Project Cost:* \$3,875,778 (90% FAA, 8% FDOT, 2% Airport)

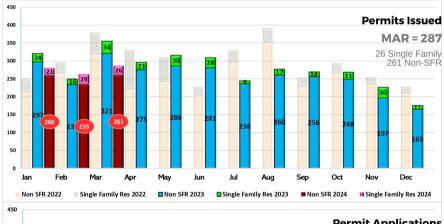

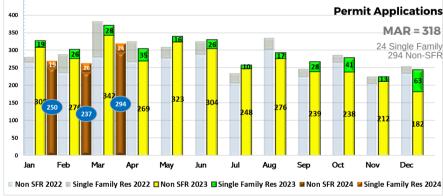

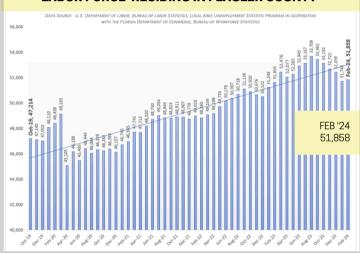

LABOR FORCE RESIDING IN FLAGLER COUNTY

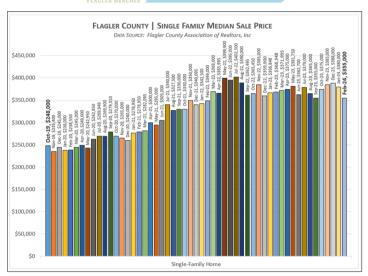

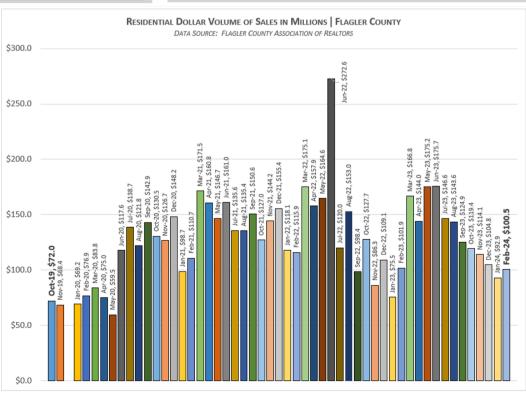
