Commissioners,

Congratulations on another groundbreaking! On August 12 you tossed shovels along Central Commerce Parkway for our new "Nexus Center" – a facility which will be part library, part social services facility, and wholly community-centric.

The Nexus Center will house senior congregate meals, will offer free access to robust broadband services, offer community meeting spaces, and provide an additional library to our fast growing population.

Many initiatives this month contributed to the amenities that make Flagler County a great place to live, from pleasantries to necessities.

Four pickleball courts were added at Wadsworth Park, alongside two existing tennis courts, and three of the existing pickleball courts at Hammock Community Center have been refurbished.

The Federal Aviation Administration awarded a "Certificate of Waiver" to our drone team, allowing long-range operations which will afford staff the ability to conduct coastline assessments and public safety missions. And the drone team has incorporated "TruWeather" sensing capabilities to overcome low-altitude weather-related obstacles like heavy rains, high winds, extreme temperatures, smoke and fog; a critical capability for our emergency response strategies.

Housing Services is developing a pre-qualified pool of general and residential building and roofing contractors - licensed and insured, in good standing, experienced in home rehabilitation, renovations, and roofing – available to quote various Housing Program projects.

County communications products were recognized by the National Association of County Information Officers. "Coast to Country" digital magazine took a "Best" in category, while the website Transparency Dashboards and a feature-article on Forestry Supervisor Risch's vouchering of local species were also recognized for "Excellence."

Emergency Management Director Jonathan Lord has graduated from the FEMA Emergency Management Institute's National Emergency Management Executive Academy.







NEW: GENERAL AVIATION TERMINAL CONSTRUCTION -

This project will replace the existing 6,400 SF metal terminal building which is approximately 40 years old and houses the airport staff, Fixed Base Operator (FBO), a pilot's lounge area, and public restrooms.

The new 15,000 SF terminal will accommodate Airport Administrative Offices, an FBO and its appurtenant facilities, public space, meeting space, and room for additional small tenants. Construction of this project is anticipated to begin Fall 2024.

Funding has been identified and is in place to construct the new Terminal. The project will be put out to bid in September 2024.

Hoyle, Tanner & Associates is compiling the documents for the bid package. *Project Cost: Estimated \$10,000,000*







LABOR FORCE RESIDING IN FLAGLER COUNTY




