FLAGLER EXECUTIVE AIRPORT UPDATES

Warbirds Over Flagler on March 25, drew roughly 4,000! A family-fun day, the air festival included static vintage and modern military aircraft and vehicles, warbird-flyby's, remote control aircraft demonstrations, music, food, and local vendors. The event honors veterans and the freedoms they dedicate themselves to, for the benefit of all.


<u>T-HANGAR CONSTRUCTION</u> - S.E. Cline constructing connector road. Installed all drainage structures for crossing. M&M (subcontractor) constructed foundation for Building F and building / roof construction begun. Building G pad preparation completed. Footers and foundation construction is upcoming.

<u>AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER EQUIPMENT</u> - *No change*. Backup weather system: The final installation slated for December was delayed due to unavailability of part. Installation will be completed once that is available.

TAXIWAY A- Airport Director, Contractor Halifax Paving and T-Hanger project Contractor S.E. Cline met to re-set date for Notice to Proceed to May 1. This delay will allow Cline time for foundation-pours prior to taxiway demo. Halifax Paving completed field verifications of existing drainage structures and is developing updated shop drawings and submittals. They are also processing material submittals ahead of the start of construction. Slated to break ground on May 1st, 2023.

GENERAL AVIATION TERMINAL RAMP - No change. Halifax Paving (Contractor) and Hoyle Tanner (Engineer) finalizing all submittals and logistics. 25-week lead-time for drainage structures is driving a construction start in July- August of 2023.

ENTERPRISE CAR WASH FACILITY & PARKING LOT EXPANSION - The contractor has completed the block building and the roof trusses have been installed. The four roll-up doors have been installed as well. They have been working on the finish grade for the parking lot.

REAL ESTATE


- The dollar volume of sales indicates a slow-down in the market, from the peak seen during the pandemic, in spite of the increase of individual pricing of residential units.
- Although down from its peak in November 2022 of \$402,500, the median sale price for a singlefamily home at \$368,348 is significantly higher than it was four years ago by 48.5%.
