HIGHLIGHTS IN JULY

Commissioners,

July arrived with a torrent of activity.

Wet-season storms and extreme weather have Emergency Management and General Services working hard for our residents. Honing the budget for the upcoming fiscal year has moved into its most dynamic stage. Health and Human Services aided roughly 47% more residents with utility assistance in the month just closed, than in the month before. The Airport played a central role in the Unified Flagler 4th festivities. Emergency sand placement was coordinated by Engineering so that our parks were available to residents and visitors anxious to enjoy Flagler's beaches over the economically important 4th of July holiday.

News of state appropriations was favorable for your three top funding priorities for the County – Combined Fire Administration and Fire Station, Acquisition of Conservation Lands, and an Integrated Stabilization Unit and Men's Substance Abuse facility. News came from FDEP that they were allocating additional funds toward our dunes-restoration efforts. Work begins to bring all these initiatives, and more, to fruition.

You yourselves are freshly returned from the Florida Association of Counties' Annual Conference. Your agenda there included workshops on the development of a strong county culture; investments in community violence interventions; implementation of the new Affordable Housing "Live Local Act"; as well as seminars on resiliency; broadband success in rural areas; and avenues to pursue infrastructure-funding opportunities.

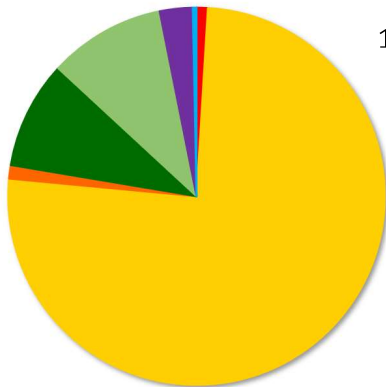
TIMBER INVENTORY EVALUATION - WITH ECOLOGICAL TIMBER THINNING

- Blue Parcel timber is 80% complete. Due to rain, Loggers have moved on, to return in dryer season.
- LM estimates \$120K revenue from Blue Parcel Timber received thus far. That revenue is restricted 50/50 between Blue Parcel and Princess Place Preserve
- Gopher Tortoise Conservation easement received from FWC
- Will present a Conservation Easement for Princess Place potential revenue of \$500k, in August for the Board's consideration

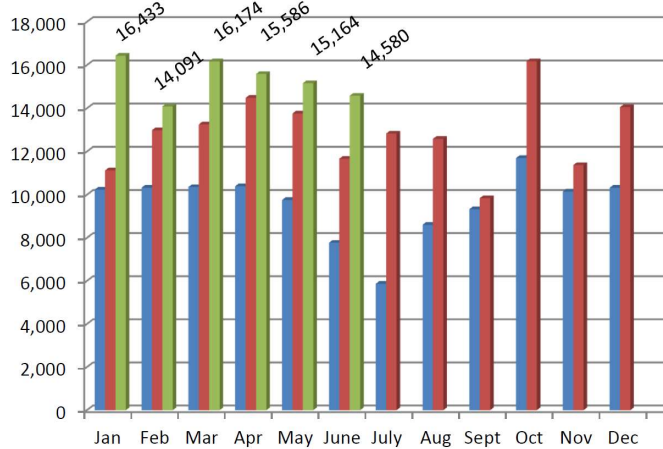

T-HANGAR CONSTRUCTION - Construction is on schedule. S.E. Cline working on connector road and drainage structures. M&M (sub-contractor) is close to completing Building F. Roof and exterior walls comple, interior walls under construction on Building G. Utility Easement for FP&L to provide power completed. The contractor is awaiting date for FP&L to install power.

AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER EQUIPMENT - Two outstanding items needed to complete: Backup Weather System and GPS Clock & Display. The Board approved Resolution on June 5, amending funding from FDOT for \$20,365 for equipment / installation. Contractor has ordered both items.

TAXIWAY A - As noted in prior report, the Airport Director issued a cease-work order to GAI Consultants requiring them to discontinue construction services, due to loss of key staff for the project. With this action, the Director prepared Work Authorization No. WA-10 for Hoyle Tanner & Associates to conduct the CEI Services for the project. The Authorization was brought to the BoCC On July 10. The date of the Construction 'Notice to Proceed' date for contractor Halifax Paving was postponed to July 6.

GENERAL AVIATION TERMINAL RAMP - No change. Halifax Paving (Contractor) and Hoyle Tanner (Engineer) finalizing all submittals and logistics. 25-week lead-time for drainage structures is driving a construction start in July- August of 2023.

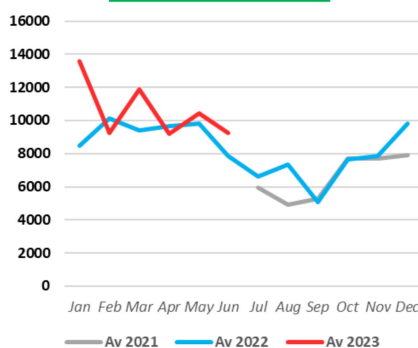

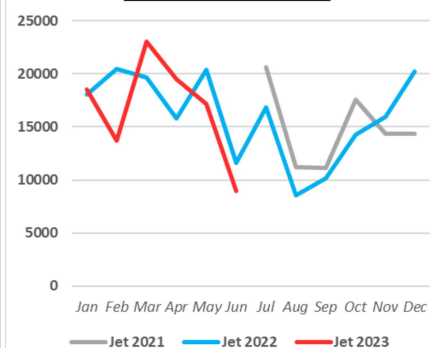

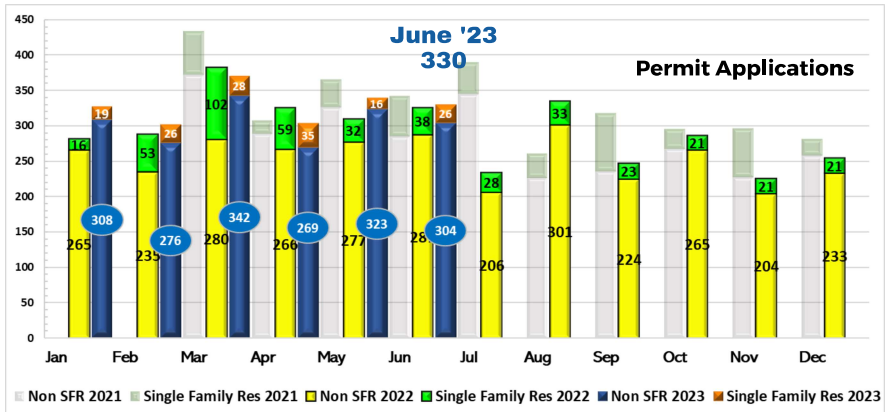
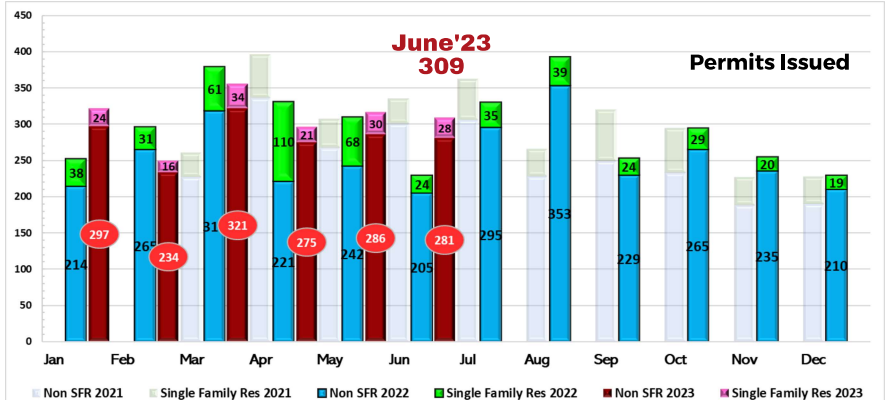
GROWTH MANAGEMENT: JUNE

6. The Solid Waste Fee on residential units approved by the Board. The implementation of the fee commenced on July 1st for all new Single Family and Mobile Home permits.

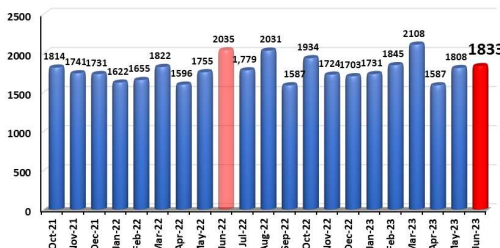

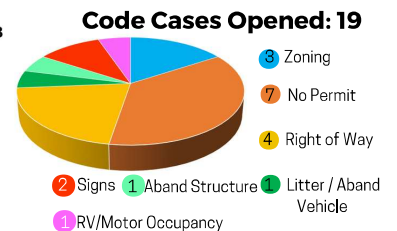

ENGINEERING JUNE UPDATES COASTLINE PROJECTS

ACOE / FDOT PROJECTS - CITY OF FLAGLER BEACH:

Funding assistance coordination continues. Procurement of construction easements in process. Requested grant extension from FDOT. Staff is coordinating with ACOE to develop a Memorandum of Understanding which will enable the ACOE to incorporate the non-federal project limits into the federal project construction. Scheduled for BOCC in August.

HURRICANE IAN & NICOLE RECOVERY PROJECT - PAINTERS HILL:

Completed dune construction at the end of May, plantings completed in June. Reimbursement and close-out in progress.

HURRICANE IAN & NICOLE RECOVERY PROJECT - SOUTH HAMMOCK:

Dune construction began June 1 and was completed June 30. Plantings were completed July 15.

HURRICANE IAN & NICOLE EMERGENCY SAND FDEP \$5 MILLION:

Approximately \$1.25 million remaining after South Hammock Dunes project, and plantings for FEMA Cat B project. The remaining grant funds may be used as a local match to the FEMA Category B project.

WASHINGTON OAKS BEACH & DUNES:

Advance payment forms sent to FDEP to eliminate financial impact to the County. This work is 100% FDEP funded. Construction completed. Project closeout in progress.

HURRICANE DORIAN - FEMA PROJECT PW215:

Sand placement was completed end of February. Reimbursement and closeout in process.

BEACH MANAGEMENT PLAN:

Purpose is to evaluate existing beach and dune conditions and, with county and stakeholder input, develop future management activities and evaluate funding options.

Funding Study commenced on March 9 and is underway. A survey is scheduled to be disseminated to public, mid-August through mid-September. A Beach Management Workshop is scheduled for the Board August 28.

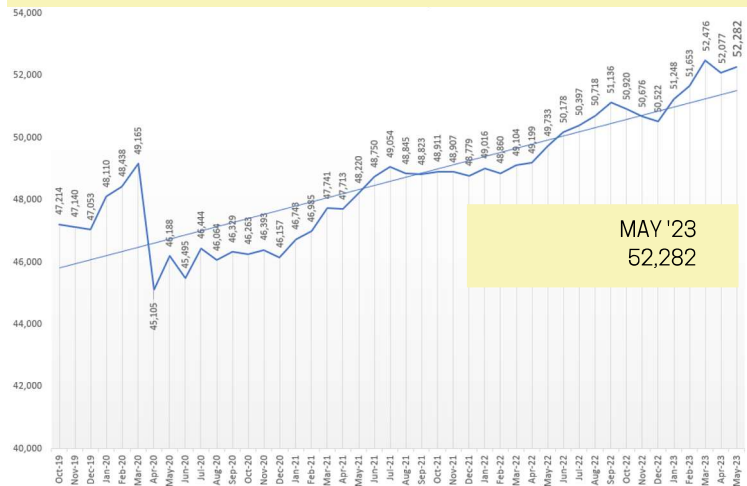

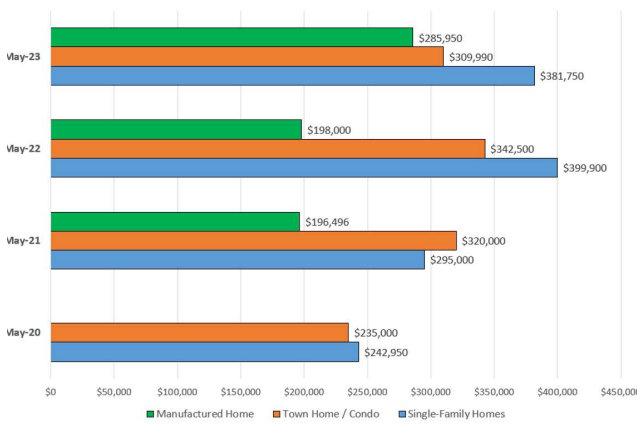

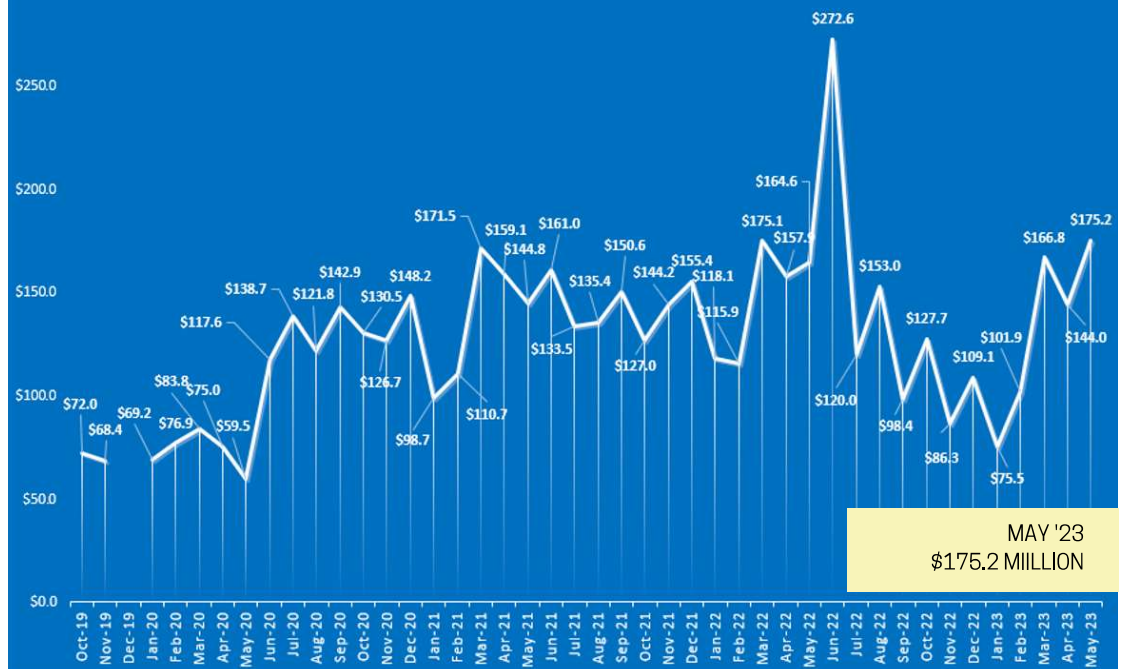
