July 12, 2023

1. **Pledge of Allegiance** - Chair Staly called the meeting to order and lead the Council in the pledge of allegiance.
2. **Roll Call** - Roll call was taken reflecting a quorum was present.
3. **Opening Comments** - Chair Staly welcomed members and made opening remarks.
4. **Approval of Meeting Minutes:** Prior PSCC meeting minutes dated April 12, 2023 were reviewed and unanimously approved.
5. **Old Business:**
 - a. Jail Occupancy Report - Chief Daniel Engert
 - b. Mental Health Report – SMA
 - c. CJMHSA Grant Progress Report – Carrie Baird
6. **New Business:**
 - a. Chief Dan Engert – Presented Inmate Population Analysis/Sentenced v. pre-trial; local sentenced v. DOC sentenced etc.; what is driving increased population.
 - b. Carrie Baird – Reviewed Crime Prevention Grant Application Scores.
7. **Council Comments**
 - a. Sheriff Staly and Chief Engert discussed Jail Population Analysis to include indirect supervision v. direct supervision. Commissioner O'Brien inquired about the possibility of leveling off. Matt Metz requested 2018-2019 Inmate Population Analysis during COVID to compare to current Analysis.
 - b. Three Crime Prevention Grant Applications were received for 2023-2024, each making a 3-minute presentation.

It was discussed and decided that the Grant Allocation of \$30,000.00 would be divided between two entities with EPIC Community Services Inc. (dba EPIC Behavioral Healthcare) receiving \$20,000 to increase the hours of their current part-time Transition Specialist. The increased hours would provide access to treatment for the target population of incarcerated individuals.

Flagler Sheriff's PAL Inc. would be allotted the remaining \$10,000.00 to support the facilitation of bringing the sport of boxing to Flagler County as a proven youth crime reduction strategy. In addition, mentorship, mental health and substance abuse education and life skills development will be provided.

The Public Safety Coordinating Council eagerly anticipates the implementation of this Grant allocation to significantly support the Flagler County Community.

Sheriff Staly reiterated that a Form 8B will need to be completed by those who have a conflict within 15 days to be attached to the minutes.

- c. A conversation held by the PSCC members, prompted by Judge Distler, was over the pending implementation of changes to the Florida Statute on Pretrial and Detention under HB 1627. Specifically, the Judge raised concerns and problems with how the information on the offenders is recorded and retrieved. As this information is recorded by the Clerk's Office, the PSCC requested a presentation from Mark Weinberg from the Clerk of the Court's Office for the meeting scheduled for October 11, 2023. Changes to the statute are summarized below:

HB 1627 Pretrial release and Detention (HB 1627)

1. Establishes a statewide uniformity for bond schedules.
2. Adds following offences to the definition of a dangerous crime:
 - a. DUI/BUI Manslaughter;
 - b. Extortion;
 - c. Trafficking fentanyl;
 - d. Written threats to kill.
3. Requires a detention hearing to be held prior to trial for dangerous crimes.
4. If the Court finds a substantial probability the defendant committed the offense and based on the defendant's past and present patterns of behavior no conditions of release or bail will reasonably protect the community and ensure the defendant is present at trial the court must order pretrial detention.
5. Requires the following arrestees to be held until first appearance:
 - a. A person arrested for a capital, life, first, second degree felonies; or
 - b. A person at the time of arrest was designated a sexual offender or sexual predator in this state or any other.
 - c. A person who at the time of arrest was on pre-trial release, probation, of community control in this state or any other.
 - d. A person who has, at any time before the current arrest, been sentenced pursuant to §§775.082(9) or 775.084 as a prison releasee reoffender, habitual violent

- felony offender, three-time violent felony offender, or violent career criminal.
 - e. A person who has been arrested 3-times in previous 6-months.
 - f. A person arrested for violating a protective injunction.
 - g. A person arrested for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.
 - h. A person arrested for child abuse or aggravated child abuse.
 - i. A person arrested for sexual battery; indecent, lewd, or lascivious touching, exposure of sexual organs, incest, luring or enticing a child, or child pornography.
 - j. A person arrested for abuse, neglect, or exploitation of an elderly or disabled person.
 - k. A person arrested for arson, riot, aggravated riot, inciting a riot, or aggravated inciting a riot, or a burglary or theft during a riot.
 - l. A person arrested for escape; tampering or retaliating against a witness, victim, or informant; destruction of evidence; or tampering with a jury.
 - m. A person arrested for any offense committed for the purpose of benefiting, promoting, or furthering the interests of a criminal gang.
 - n. A person arrested for trafficking in a controlled substance, including conspiracy to engage in trafficking a controlled substance.
 - o. A person arrested for racketeering.
 - p. A person arrested for failure to appear at required court proceeding while on bail.
6. Effective January 1, 2024.

8. Public Comments – No public comments were made.

9. Closing Remarks – Chair Staly summarized the meeting and provided closing remarks.

10. Next Meeting – January 10, 2024 at 8:45 a.m. and will be located in the Emergency Operations Center.

11. Adjournment – The meeting adjourned at 10:05 a.m.

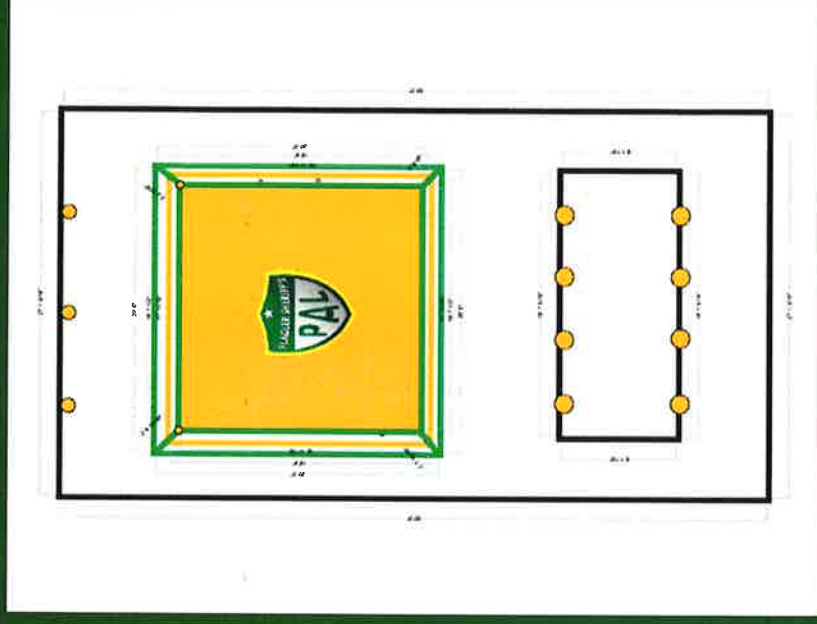
Sheriffs Providing Adolescent Care and Empowerment



The Sheriffs Providing Adolescent Care and Empowerment Program will serve at-risk-youth in Flagler County. This demographic tends to come from broken homes or lacks the support of two parents. These children tend to find trouble both in and out of school such as vaping, narcotic use and sales, as well as violent and non-violent crime. This program is designed to provide positive role models, who by spending time with the youth, will build relationships and teach them basic life skills. We will focus on team building skills through boxing and mental health to help the youth transition into productive and positive members of society.

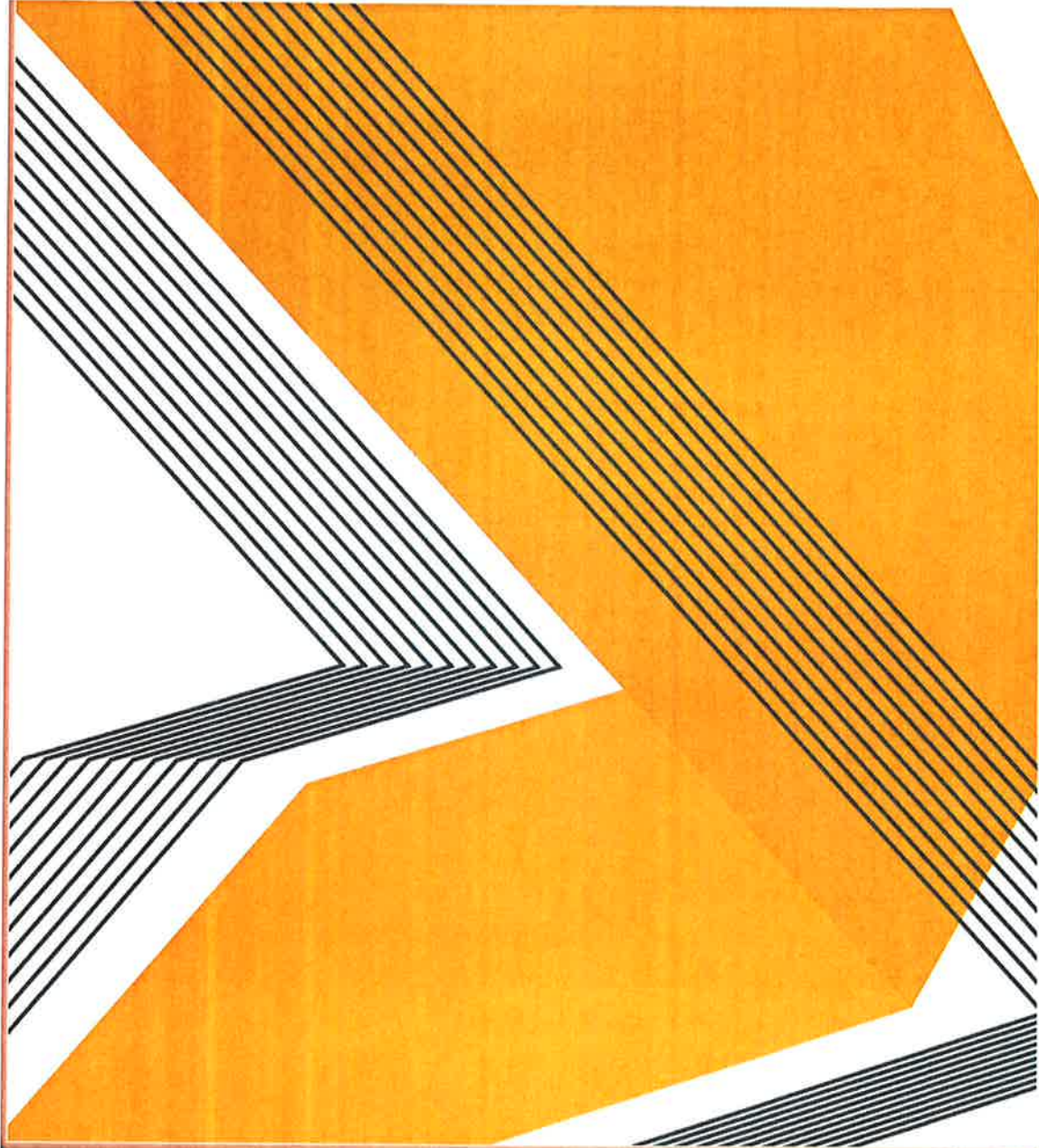

Flagler County Jail EPIC Transition Program



JET: How Did It Begin?

The Jail EPIC Transition (JET) program began as a collaborative effort with the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office (SJSO) to assist high utilizers of the criminal justice system with their transition out of jail and back into the community. JET is a voluntary program that provides mental health and/or substance use treatment, care coordination, and peer support services to incarcerated/recently released individuals in order to **aid their recovery and reduce recidivism**. The pilot for the JET Grant was initialized in 2018, with the first clients starting in the JET Program in July 2019. The pilot of the Grant ended September 30, 2022. Lutheran Services Florida began providing funding through their Jail Bridge program in October 2022 in St. Johns County and then branched into Flagler County early 2023.

The JET Program provides mental health and substance use disorder treatment services in jail and one-year post release. Each client is assigned a care coordinator to assist them during the transition from jail into the community who meets with them weekly for 90 days and then as needed for the remainder of the year.

The JET Program also implements intensive care coordination for persons and peer support services upon discharged from the Flagler County Detention Center. The JET Program is based on the Transition from Jail to Community (TJC) evidence-based model from the National Institute of Corrections.

Jail Bridge Program

Jail Bridge is a new initiative for many LSF Health System network providers. Jail Bridge programs provide vital recovery support to decrease overdoses and recidivism rates. The Flagler County JET program has been included in the Jail Bridge state initiative which is funded through federal State Opioid Response (SOR) dollars.

Data is collected on:

*the number of individuals screened

*the numbers of individuals receiving Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) services in jail prior to discharge

* the type of MAT

*the number of individuals referred to community services

*the number of individuals linked to community services.

Staffing

The JET Team is comprised of:

- ❖ Manager of Criminal Justice Programs
- ❖ JET/SMART Clinician
- ❖ 1 JET Care Coordinator
- ❖ ¹/₂ Time JET Transition Specialist
- ❖ 1 JET Peer Support Recovery Specialist



Community Partnerships

❖ FCSO Corrections – provides initial screening of inmates through Primecare sent to JET Transition Specialist/Care Coordinator.

❖ SMART Program – clients are able to access JET Transition to Community Program for added support services upon completion of substance use/mental health intervention program in the jail.

❖ Emmanuel's Closet – provides outfits/clothing vouchers for clients upon release from jail.

❖ Drug Court – participants can access JET program services for added support while completing outpatient treatment services within the treatment court.

❖ Oxford Sober Living Housing – provides access to housing options for our clients.

❖ FlaglerCares – Assist with services and service connection for clients.

❖ SMA-connects clients with services provided by Stewart Marchman-Act Behavioral Healthcare

JET Program Components

Screening - Initial screening by
Primecare, further assessment by
JET Transition Specialist.

Intake - Assessment and intake by
JET Transition Specialist after team
review.

Care Coordination - Essential
linkage to services in the community.

Peer Support - Supportive person
whom clients relate to with lived
experience.

Counseling - Individual substance
use and mental health counseling,
as well as multiple groups available.

Screening and Intake

Clients, how are they on-boarded?

Referrals received from Flagler County Jail, medical staff, inmate requests, Programs Deputy, Court and Probation.

Inmate's meeting criteria are then administered a more in-depth screening by the JET Transition Specialist

JET Transition Specialist staff's potential referrals weekly with the team to determine eligibility and ability to participate in treatment services

Clients are accepted after team approvals each week and intake and enrollment is completed

Work begins with the client in the Jail in the Jail to prepare for their transition to the community

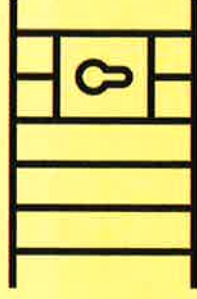

WHO MUST FILE FORM 8B

This form is for use by any person serving at the county, city, or other local level of government on an appointed or elected board, council, commission, authority, or committee. It applies to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office **MUST ABSTAIN** from voting on a measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also **MUST ABSTAIN** from knowingly voting on a measure which would inure to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent, subsidiary, or sibling organization of a principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies (CRAs) under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

For purposes of this law, a "relative" includes only the officer's father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law. A "business associate" means any person or entity engaged in or carrying on a business enterprise with the officer as a partner, joint venturer, coowner of property, or corporate shareholder (where the shares of the corporation are not listed on any national or regional stock exchange).

* * * * *

ELECTED OFFICERS:

In addition to abstaining from voting in the situations described above, you must disclose the conflict:

PRIOR TO THE VOTE BEING TAKEN by publicly stating to the assembly the nature of your interest in the measure on which you are abstaining from voting; *and*

WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

* * * * *

APPOINTED OFFICERS:

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you are not prohibited by Section 112.3143 from otherwise participating in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:

- You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who will incorporate the form in the minutes. (Continued on page 2)

APPOINTED OFFICERS (continued)

- A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency.
- The form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.

IF YOU MAKE NO ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION EXCEPT BY DISCUSSION AT THE MEETING:

- You must disclose orally the nature of your conflict in the measure before participating.
- You must complete the form and file it within 15 days after the vote occurs with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who must incorporate the form in the minutes. A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency, and the form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.

Should anyone have any questions they should feel free to reach out to me directly, via email or my cell – 386-290-7333.

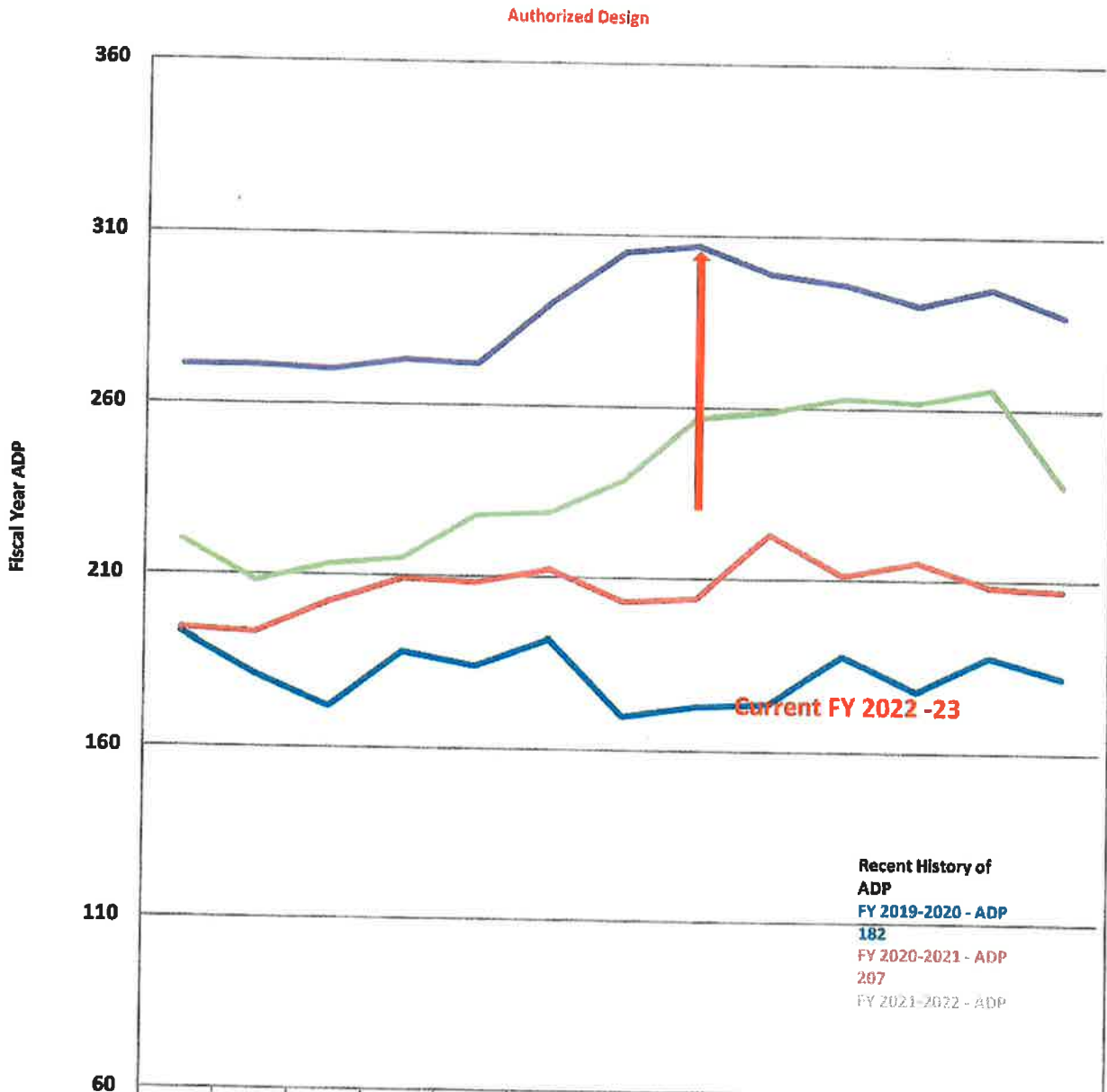

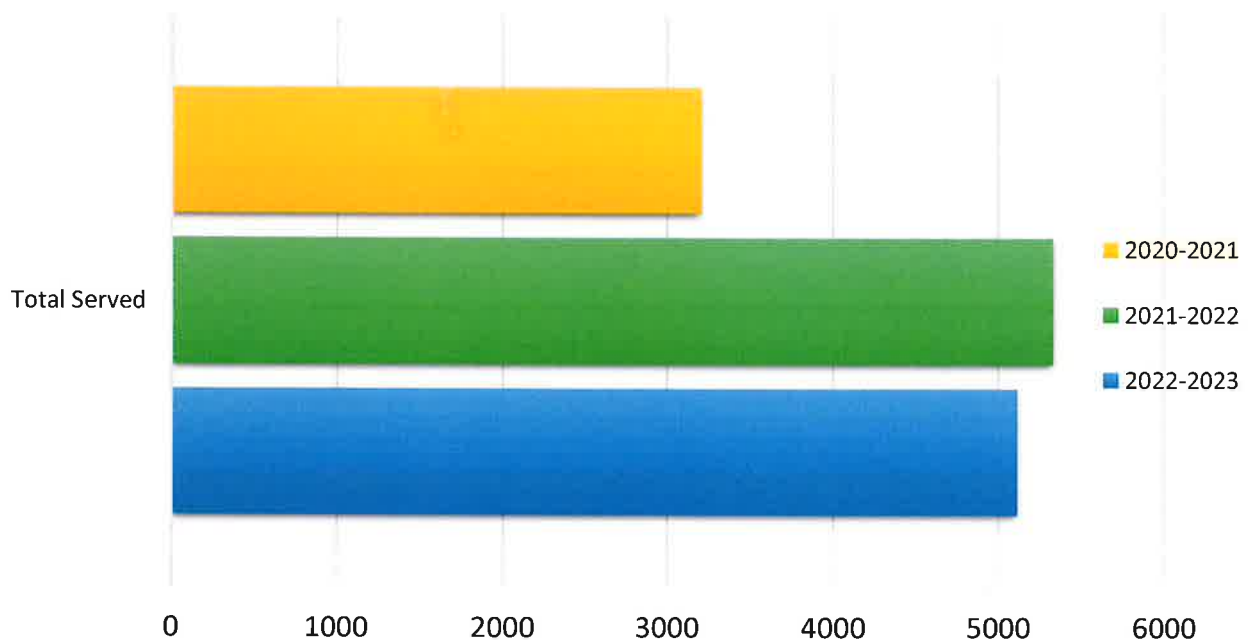

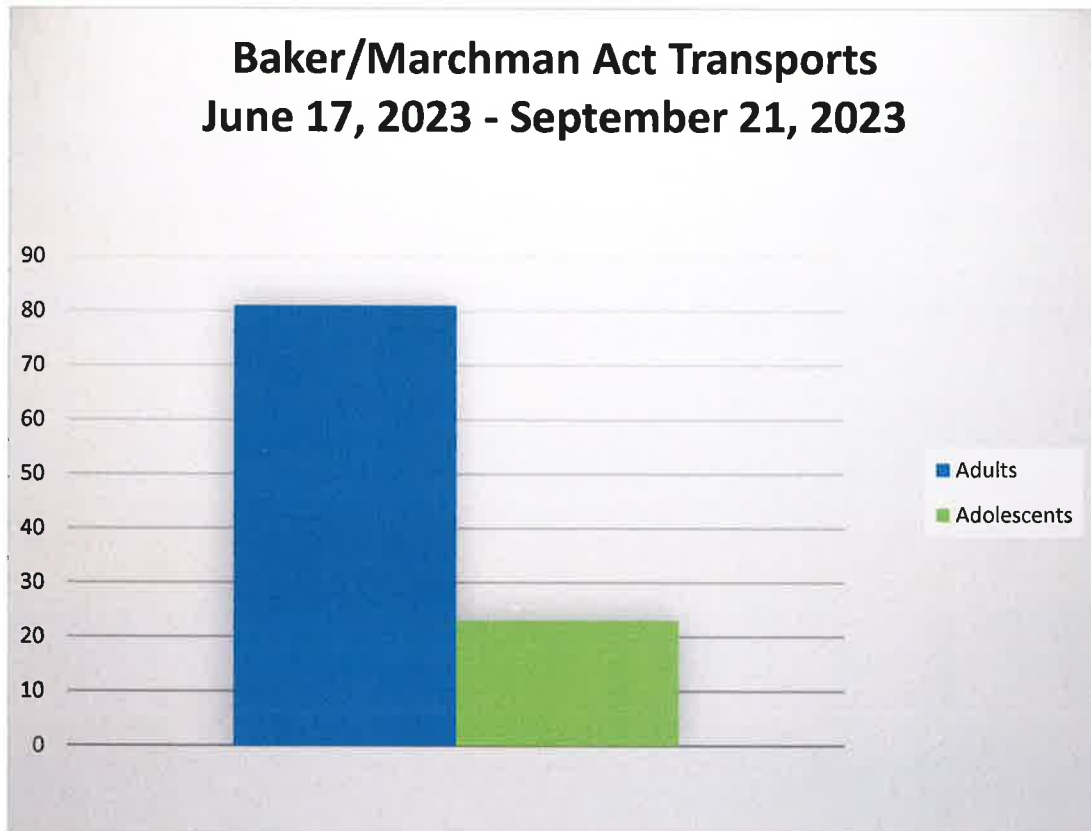

Flagler Youth & Young Adult Diversion Expansion Program

Progress Report: April to June 2023

The grant funded program began on October 1, 2021 as a continuation and expansion of the previous youth-focused diversion project that operated for the previous three years.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- **Started 10-1-21:** Early identification of behavioral health concerns and delinquency risk among school aged youth, referrals for services and care coordination. Implemented by Flagler Schools and Halifax Health.
- **Started 10-1-21:** Behavioral Health services and support enhancement to Flagler Schools' Restorative School/Alternative Placement program for school aged youth
- **Started September 2022:** Co-Responder program with Flagler County Sheriff's Office creating new capacity to respond with deputies to a behavioral health crisis and provide follow-up care coordination to young adults & youth

NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS SCREENED & ENROLLED (cumulative)

- **3,568** Individuals Screened
- **1,949** students screened who required services
- **173** youth and youth adults enrolled in the program

Program Goals:

- Increase access for at risk youth and young adults to effective mental health and substance abuse interventions, at the earliest point, to prevent contact with the juvenile/adult justice system and to ensure a successful transition after justice involvement into appropriate school and community-based care
- Engage Program partners, Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC) agencies, and community behavioral health providers in the Flagler Expansion Project to support adoption and adherence to shared values and goals, regular communication, data sharing and strategic partnership.

Target Population:

- School-aged youth and young adults up to age 25, with both risk factors for justice involvement (or actual involvement) and indicators of mental health or substance abuse concerns.

RE: Adoption of Gain-time Schedule for County Jail Inmates

On April 7, 2007, the BOCC voted to delegate the establishment of gain-time criteria to the Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC). A review of the PSCC minutes from 2007 through 2023 determined the PSCC did not adopt a formal gain-time schedule.

Gain-time is allowed by statute to encourage satisfactory county inmate behavior; to provide incentive for county inmates to participate in productive activities and program; and, to reward county inmates who perform outstanding deeds or services while incarcerated. Florida Statute §951.21(1) provides a county inmate may earn up to 5-days per month gain-time for the first and second years of their sentence. Also, under §951.21(3) the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC), at its discretion, may adopt a policy providing gain-time of up to 5-days, per month. The statute also states a county inmate cannot earn more than 10 gain-time days, per month.

Examples of gain-time in the Sheriff Perry Hall Inmate Detention Facility are listed in Appendix A. However, programs for inmates in the county jail are always changing and evolving and Appendix A is not intended to be all inclusive. Therefore, to provide flexibility and future programming changes and promote participation and successful inmate completion, I recommend the PSCC adopt the following County jail gain-time policy:

- *The PSCC adopts and formally authorizes the Sheriff of Flagler County to award up to 5-days gain-time but not exceeding 10-days per month total state and county gain-time. Further, the Sheriff has the discretion to design and implement programs that are eligible for inmate gain-time as long as the awarding of county jail gain-time will promote correctional goals including, but not limited to, successful participation in the SMART program, educational, vocational, and occupational work programs performed by County sentenced inmates. In addition, the Sheriff may award inmates with gain-time for outstanding deeds or services while incarcerated in accordance with this policy and state law.*
