FOCUSED ON OUR GOALS

Commissioners,

As I take a moment to reflect on the past several weeks, I'm thankful for this opportunity to share with you some of the recent achievements of Flagler County's dedicated staff.

Every month, every season, comes with both obstacles and accomplishments. And often the steps that are taken to overcome challenges, and the initiatives to improve services, will dominate the conversation. People who work in public service just have that focus – on making strides to improve the lives of the people we serve. While we're focused on those efforts, we can neglect to "toot our own horn".

But Flagler County staff members have also experienced many accomplishments recently, and I would like to take this moment to shine a light on some of these important milestones.

- Flagler County Emergency Management has earned accreditation through the Emergency Management Accreditation Program, meeting requirements certified by the American National Standard Institute, and demonstrating standards of excellence in 16 areas.
- Fire Rescue Chief Tucker has been redesignated Chief Fire Officer by the Commission on Professional Credentialing. This is his fifth time earning the designation and makes Chief one of only 1,858 worldwide.
- Human Resources Director Wu is now titled an Association of Workplace Investigators Certificate Holder. Pam's pursuit of this professional certification is a testament to her dedication to a fair and equitable work environment for Flagler County.
- And finally, the collaborative presentation just made to our Legislative Delegation – a once-a-year opportunity to highlight the programs that will best-serve residents from all five municipalities and the county – would not have been so impactful without the community-wide coordination efforts of Chief of Special Projects and Library Director Holly Albanese.

T-HANGAR CONSTRUCTION - Due to labor-shortage issues and FPL delays, progress is slower than expected. S.E.Cline has indicated they will submit a request for additional time. M&M Development & Construction (sub) is in the final stages for Buildings F and G. Erecting Building H progresses. The concrete T-Hangar entrance ramps for each hangar in buildings F and G have been completed. FPL coordinated all needs for the transformers and meters installation. Awaiting the final date for site-power installation


AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER EQUIPMENT - The tower for the Backup Weather System delivered to contractor and is awaiting painting within the next month. Installation expected in October.

TAXIWAY A - Halifax Paving completed Phase 3 of construction: demolition of the existing taxiway, construction of the new base and asphalt surface courses, and related drainage, airfield signage, and lighting for the central portion of Taxiway A. Progressing ahead of schedule. Final striping will be completed in 30 days, as will sodding. The portion from the east end of Taxiway A to Taxiway A1 still needs the top-lift of asphalt - can be completed once the T-hangar project is further along.

GENERAL AVIATION TERMINAL RAMP - Airport Director issued the Notice to Proceed to Halifax Paving on September 22, with a commencement date of October 2, 2023.

SEP 6 Director Sieger attended the Flagler County Legislative Priorities Workshop in support of construction funding for General Aviation Terminal facility.

SEP 8 Director Sieger gave deposition for Pen and Pilot case and on Sept. 11 participated in the court mandated mediation.






