PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

We have spent more than a bit of time with each other, and residents, over the last several months.

In July and August alone you scheduled twelve public meetings - a combination of regular BoCC meetings, BoCC workshops, Budget workshops, BoCC special meetings, and initiative-focused public workshop and meetings. We have published more than 2,300 pages of staff reports and agenda-item back-up. Flagler County's published Tentative Budget, under your consideration for FY2023-24, is an additional 200+ pages.

Your board was recently provided its first look at the Stormwater Master Plan Draft report, including the recommended Capital Improvement Project list for stormwater management and a more resilient community infrastructure. The public was invited to a workshop at the end of July, and through August and September we will continue to solicit public input on the draft. There is a section of our website dedicated to those efforts.

The end of August will see a workshop encouraging public participation in the creation of the 2050 Comprehensive Plan.




T-HANGAR CONSTRUCTION - Construction on schedule. S.E. Cline constructing connector road, finalizing drainage structures. M&M Development & Construction (sub) is in the final stages of completing Building F and Building G. Construction of Building H to start early August. FP&L coordination continues. The conduit for power has been installed, however additional is needed. Once installation is complete, the date for FP&L to power the site will be determined.

AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER EQUIPMENT - No Changes. The contractor has ordered two items - the Backup Weather System and the GPS Clock and Display. Once received, the installation will be scheduled.

TAXIWAY A - On July 6, Halifax Paving began construction on Taxiway A. The contractor completed Phase 1 on July 14 for the east side of taxiway between Taxiways E and A1. This included demolition of the existing taxiway, construction of new base course and asphalt surface course. Drainage, signage, and lighting were also completed. Phase 2 began July 17, addressing 550 ft of the west end of Taxiway A. Subcontractor 4C's Trucking and Excavation began demolition and replacement of stormwater pipe in front of the current T-Hangars. A temporary taxilane was constructed for T-Hangar tenants to get access / move aircraft. There were minimal closures during construction of the stormwater pipe. The BoCC approved Work Authorization No. WA-10 on July 10 for Hoyle Tanner & Associates to conduct the CEI Services for the Taxiway Reconstruction project.

GENERAL AVIATION TERMINAL RAMP Hoyle Tanner (Engineer), Halifax Paving (Contractor), and Director Sieger resolved the cost escalation issues. Preconstruction meeting was held July 6. The engineer is reviewing shop drawings and the contractor will order the drainage structures once they are approved. There is a 12-to-16-week lead time on structures. Construction is scheduled to start in November.





ENGINEERING JUNE UPDATES COASTLINE PROJECTS

ACOE / FDOT PROJECTS - CITY OF FLAGLER BEACH:

Funding assistance coordination continues.
Procurement of construction easements in process. Requested grant extension from FDOT. Staff is coordinating with ACOE to develop a Memorandum of Understanding which will enable the ACOE to incorporate the non-federal project limits into the federal project construction. Scheduled for BOCC in August.

HURRICANE IAN & NICOLE RECOVERY PROJECT - PAINTERS HILL:

Completed dune construction at the end of May, plantings completed in June. Reimbursement and close-out in progress.

HURRICANE IAN & NICOLE RECOVERY PROJECT - SOUTH HAMMOCK:

Dune construction began June 1 and was completed June 30. Plantings were completed July 15.

HURRICANE IAN & NICOLE EMERGENCY SAND FDEP \$5 MILLION:

Approximately \$1.25 million remaining after South Hammock Dunes project, and plantings for FEMA Cat B project. The remaining grant funds may be used as a local match to the FEMA Category B project.

WASHINGTON OAKS BEACH & DUNES:

Advance payment forms sent to FDEP to eliminate financial impact to the County. This work is 100% FDEP funded. Construction completed. Project closeout in progress.

HURRICANE DORIAN - FEMA PROJECT PW215:

Sand placement was completed end of February. Reimbursement and closeout in process.

BEACH MANAGEMENT PLAN:

Purpose is to evaluate existing beach and dune conditions and, with county and stakeholder input, develop future management activities and evaluate funding options.

Funding Study commenced on March 9 and is underway. A survey is scheduled to be disseminated to public, mid-August through mid-September. A Beach Management Workshop is scheduled for the Board August 28.




